Course Description

SOC705 Honors Social Studies 7 – Integrated Global Studies (One Year): The seventh-grade social studies program focuses on the relationships and interactions between societies and cultures in both the Eastern and Western Hemispheres through historical and geographic lenses. United States history will be taught as it intersects with global issues. Topics include, but not limited to, the Scientific Revolution and Enlightenment ideas on the concept of rights, revolutions around the world, global imperialism, industrialization and the rise of organized labor, World War I and World War II, and global conflicts of the Cold War to the present, including world government and economic systems. This course will move beyond the general seventh grade Social Studies curriculum, developing a global perspective of how geography and history interact to create patterns of social interaction throughout time.

- Although I do not specifically assign much homework in this class, you must complete the readings each week. They are typically 2 sections, which amounts to less than 10 pages- not that bad! But there are weekly assignments and quizzes that go with the text every Friday, so it is critical that you complete the assigned readings!
- Complete assignments in a timely manner
- Late work is accepted until the end of the grading period, but at a deduction. Best to do it on time! If you have a valid reason that it is late, of course I will still take it without penalty.
- Be your own advocate
- o I am always available to talk whether it be during class, in between, lunch, or conference. Let me know if you have questions about the class, the content, or just life itself. I am also available via email.

Student Responsibilities

Work should be a reflection of an individual student's ideas- not that of their friend or the internet. Receiving/providing answers for an assignment, essay, quiz, or test is cheating and academic dishonesty—regardless of its form. This includes any student looking up answers online or using a chat bot to do their work for them. Any such action will result in an automatic zero, and possible referral to the office. If it happens more than once, further disciplinary action may be taken by administration.

Be respectful of others. You are free to disagree and share your opinion, but that does not extend to personal insults or attacks. Discussions in my class are just that- discussions of ideas, not people.

Do not touch the property of another student. If you borrow something with their permission, be sure to give it back.

Late work

All assignments are expected to be completed on time. If a student has an excused absence that was called in by a parent (such as an illness, family vacation, etc.), they are given the same number of days to complete the assignment as they were absent. (Ex: If you were out sick for three days, you have an extra three days to complete the assignment). If the absence was unexcused, it will be counted as late.

I do accept late work, but at a penalty. If it is received within a week of the due date, a 25% deduction will occur. If it is past two weeks, you will receive up to half credit. Note: Even then, it's still worth doing. 50% is far better than 0%!

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.
