THINGS YOU CAN DO AT HOME

*Talk about / use words outside and around your home like "flower, stem, petal, bugs, insect, wings, antennae". LOOK FOR AND EXAMINE plants/flowers outside.

*Count ANY objects around your house and then ask, "Can I have just 1, Can I have 2?"

*USE VISUALS (pictures of objects, places, actions) to emphasize what you are asking / expecting of your child. (Preschool staff can help with this if needed)

*Create a space for your child to have their backpack, etc. to go to school helping to create that routine and expectation of "going to school"

*Expect your child to follow 1 step instructions. (You can give gestures i.e. pointing, waving, etc.) "Bring me the book." "First throw away the paper, then we can....."

*Expect independence from your child i.e. expect them to follow you where you want to go without holding their hand in places you are comfortable allowing them to be.

*Expect your child to start taking care of their belongings i.e. put backpack in special spot, take things out for parent to see, throw away trash on their own, etc.

*Read short picture books to your child and talk about objects and actions in the story. Count objects (1-10), talk about the color and size of different characters.
