Things You Can Do at Home

*Talk about going to school (i.e. playing with friends, playing with toys, etc.)

*Count objects at home 1-5, then 1-10

*Talk about it being "important to go to school to become smarter and smarter like a big kid"

*Create a space for your child to have their backpack, etc. to go to school

*Expect your child to follow 1step instructions. You can give gestures i.e. pointing, waving, etc.

*Expect independence from your child i.e. give them a light bag to carry in from the car, expect them to carry their own belongings (i.e. backpack, toy, pullup, special blanket, change of clothes) to follow you where you want to go with out holding their hand in places you are comfortable allowing them to be.

*Expect your child to start taking care of their belongings i.e. put backpack in special spot, take things out for parent to see, throw away trash on their own, etc.
