Electronic Device Policy:

Tardy:

Being a student is your job. Be on time for your job. Tardy is defined as being in your seat, working on the assignment from the teacher when the final bell rings.

Late work

All work is due by the posted date and time assigned by the teacher. If submitted after the due date/time the following consequences may be applied.

Less than 48 hours late = 50%

48+ hours late = 0%

If you are to be absent from class for any reason for several days it is your responsibility to communicate with the instructor. All work can be found on Google Classroom (through the stream and classwork tabs) and it is your responsibility to complete any missed assignments. Questions regarding work assignments while being absent please contact your instructor. Students who have excused absences have at least one day every day they are absent to make up the work they missed. If you are absent on the day a physical assignment is due, it is due the day you return. Teacher discretion may be exercised in different situations.

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the [District Calendar](#).

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

Quarter grades

This class is graded using a points based system. Everything pulls equal weight, but certain assignments/tests/labs/etc. may be worth more points. Assignment point values vary. Most tests/quizzes are 100 points regardless of the number of questions. You will have projects in this class that range in points from 50-400 point. On longer projects, students may be given points for in class time work and this is in addition to the total points of the project.
