

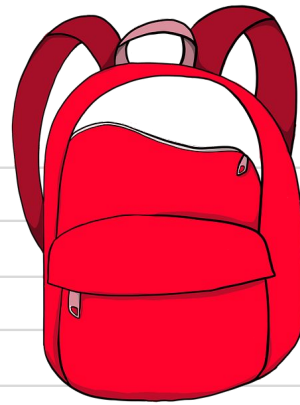


Student Absences

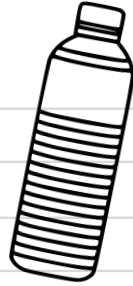

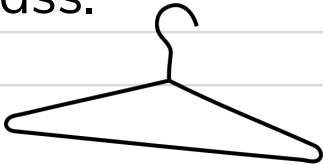

Water Bottles and Clothing

- Please check your ClassDojo/emails regularly, and purple folders daily



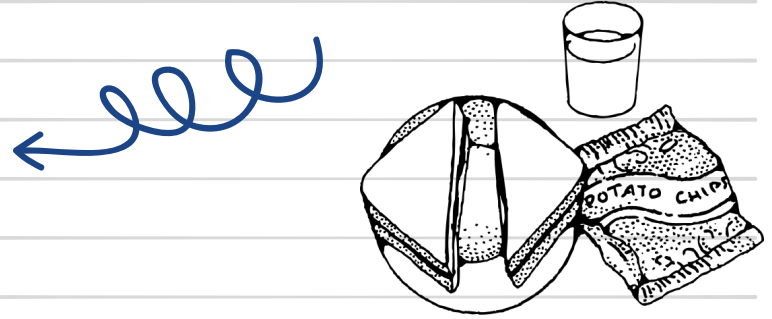
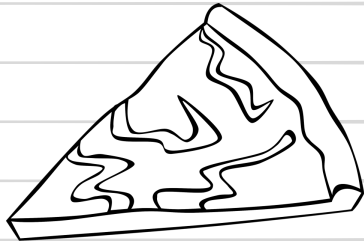
Birthdays at School

- Birthday celebrations will be held the last 20 minutes of the school day in order to not interrupt learning.

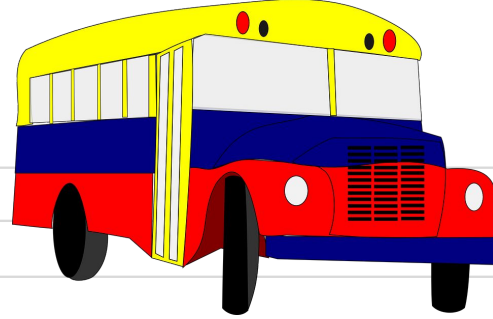

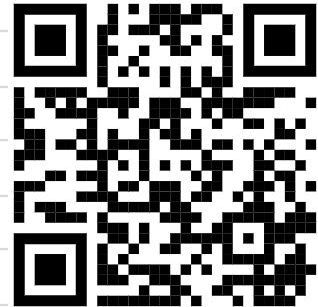
Field Trips

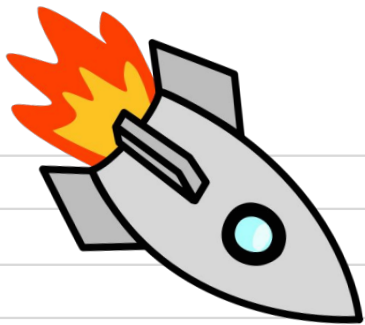


- First Grade will be going on 2-3 field trips this year.

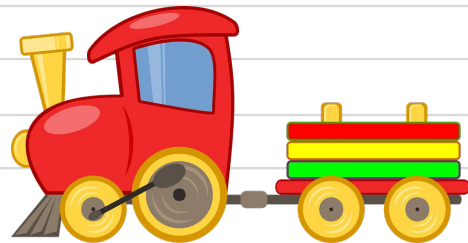

Toys

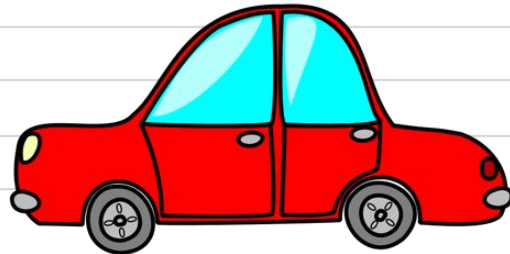
- Toys are **not** permitted, nor are they necessary, at school.

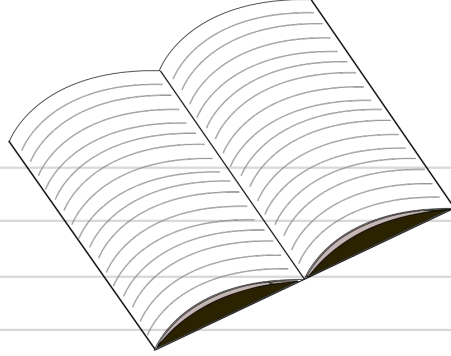


Homework Folder



- It is one form of communication (notes to/from me and important papers)
- Homework will be sent home at start of each month and returned on the next month.
- The homework includes many different activities to solidify the things we learn in class.

Reading Groups

- Reading groups will begin Monday, August 15th.
- Books will start going home in a blue reading folder. Students will be grouped according to their reading abilities.
- I work on decoding difficult words, reading fluency, various comprehension activities, etc.
- Once reading groups begin, your child will be bringing home a reading folder with a book inside. Have your child read to you. Remind them to return the book to the bag and back to school the next day. Conley Elementary has high expectations for our students reading ability. Please have your child practice reading daily.



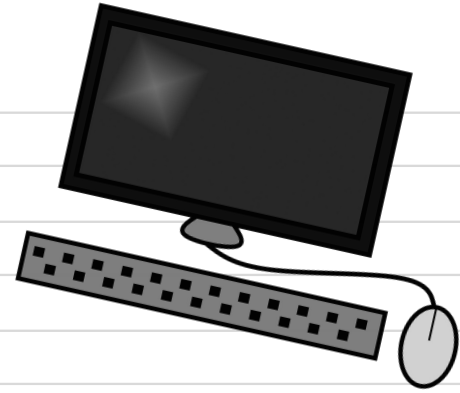


Reading Folders



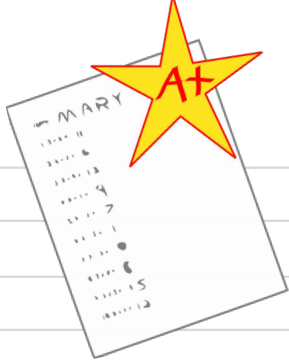
- I meet with each reading group everyday. The books go home Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.
- The reading book needs to be read by your child and **returned the following day.** Another book cannot be sent home until the previous day's book is brought back.
- Each reading book has a \$6.00 replacement cost.
- These books are directly related to our daily leveled/guided reading instruction.
- The reading folders are different from the purple Home and Back/homework folders.

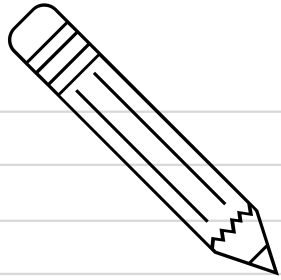


Reading Grades

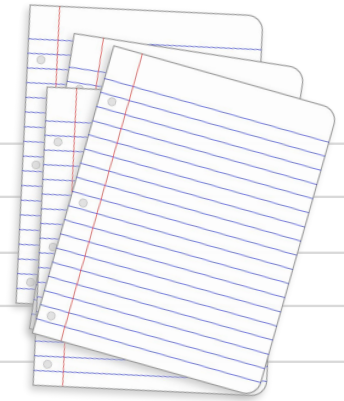
Factors that contribute to grades in reading:

- **High Frequency Words**- Fluently read the first 50/50 by September. Fluently read 100/100 high frequency words by December and 200/200 by May.
- **DIBELS**- Phoneme segmentation, nonsense word fluency, oral reading fluency, and retell
 - BLUE**: above benchmark
 - GREEN**: at the benchmark
 - YELLOW**: below benchmark
 - RED**: well below benchmark at risk





Writing & Language Arts Grades



Factors that contribute to grades in writing:

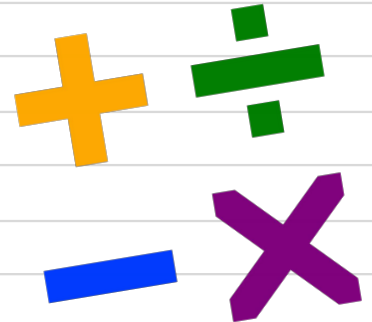
- **Writing**- opinion pieces, informative/explanatory texts, narratives, writing process, research, conventions, handwriting (legibility and correct letter formations)
- **Language**- spelling (will be graded second quarter), weekly focused rule/high frequency words
- **Vocabulary** based on weekly Into Reading's story and math concepts

Math Grades

Factors that contribute to grades in math:

Individual/small group work, Assessments (informal and formal), and **daily** -> (completion with accuracy)

- Operations and algebraic thinking (addition and subtraction)
 - represent and solving problems
 - understand and apply properties of operations and relationships
 - work with addition and subtraction equations
- Number and operations in base ten
 - extend the counting sequence
 - understand place value
 - use place value understanding and properties to add and subtract
- Measurement and data
 - measure lengths indirectly and by iterating length units
 - tell and write time
 - represent and interpret data
- Geometry
 - reason with shapes and their attributes
- Mathematical practices

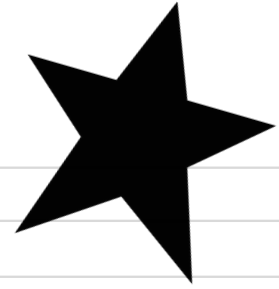

Goals For Your Student



Social Skills:

- Students should be able to state their first and last names. Teacher's name and room 10 as well.
- Students should be able to ask the teacher/other students for things in a full sentence.
- Students should be able to maintain a conversation for 2-3 turns.
- Students should be able to ask and answer questions.
- Students should be able to clean up mess they have made.
- Students should be able to express to another student something they don't like.
- Students should be able to follow the 5 class rules.
- Students should accept responsibility for actions.
- Students should be able to tie shoes. Double knots are encouraged.

Academic Goals

- Students should be able to write their names and the dates neatly.
- Students should be able to write sentences including capitals, spaces, and punctuation.
- Students should know how to count to 120 and have one to one correspondence.
- Students should be able to complete addition and subtraction problems including story problems.
- Students should be reading at grade level by the end of the school year.
- Students should be able to comprehend the story and in written form explain details, characters, setting, and problem/solution of the story.
- Students should be able to justify answers given.
- Students should be able to write and read their sight words.
- Students should be able to create consonant/vowel/consonant words (CVC).
- Students should be able to write small paragraphs (4-5 sentences) on topic.

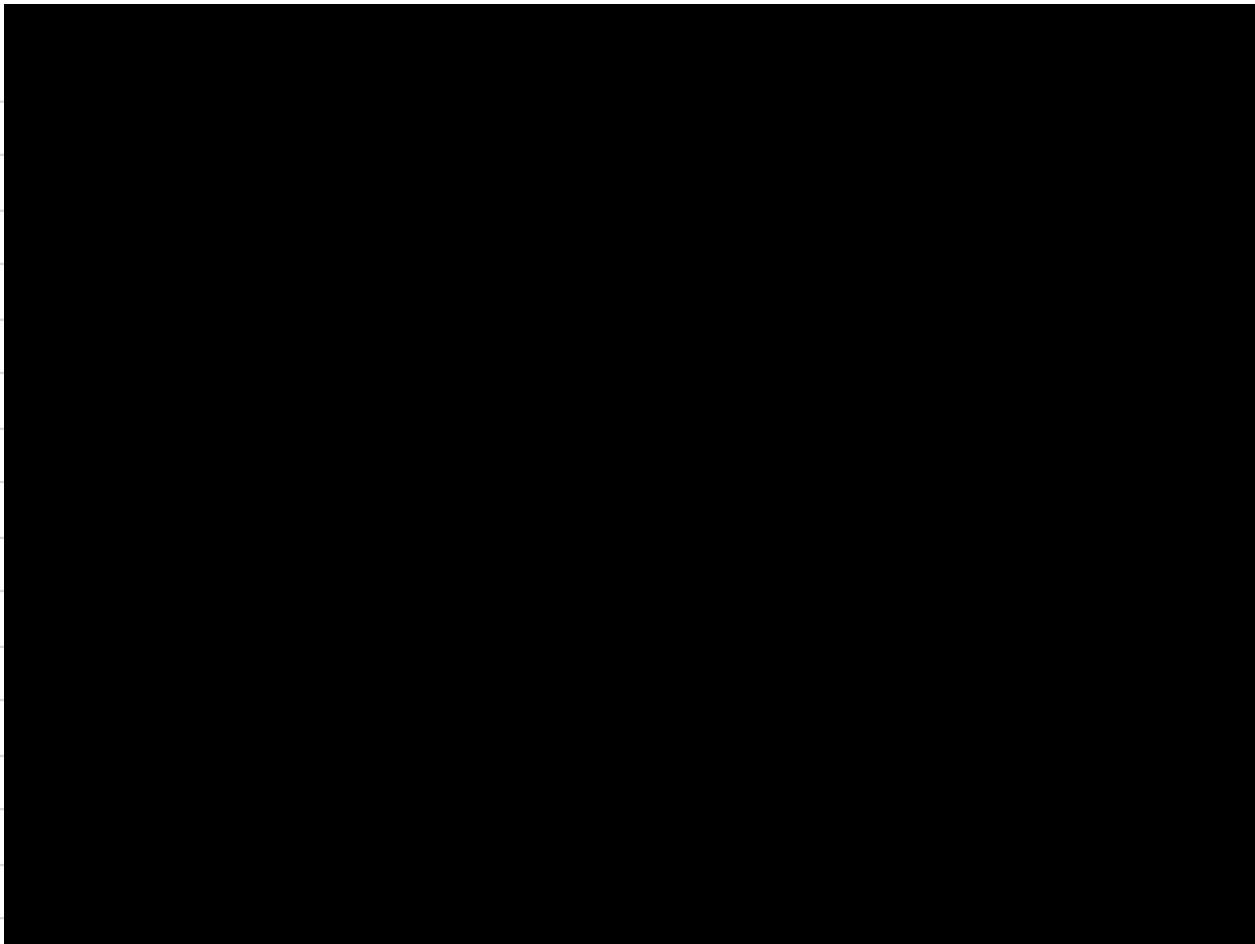




Success is Our Goal

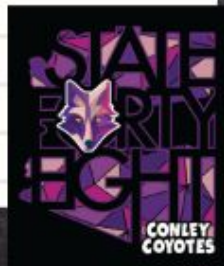
