- Rachel provided an update on the budget and PTO account activity since 7/1/2024. Current reserves are 25k
- Teacher budgets will be \$200
- The goal of the budget is to maximize profit and income.
- Budget changes
 - The winter dance has typically been planned to break even however, for the current year, it will be turned into a fundraiser
 - We will rely on creative planning for the spring carnival as this is another event that we aim to break, even but lost money last year
 - Sixth grade has elected to get T-shirts with their funds
 - There will be some cost saved by ordering spirit wear through logocommotion. PTO will package and disperse orders.

- 2. School Remarks
 - Mr. Smith provided an update on staffing and the early open enrollment schedule. Currently there are 704 students with the plan of having 4 teachers/classrooms per grade.

Mr. Smith shared the values that have been set for the school based on four common goals, what kind of learning experiences, what kind of community involvement, what kind of innovative, creativity, what kind of culture?
- 3. CEF Scholarship
 - The 24-25 1k donation was made as part of last year's budget.
- 4. NEHS Shirts
 - Pending per pending Free Dress grant.
- 5. Gardening Club
 - The gardening club is new to Liberty with hopes of involving community more and trying to get approved by the board for the entire school. There is an opportunity to have a booth at the carnival and potentially give away seeds.
- 6. Student Council

- Student council provided an example of the T-shirt. They are requesting PTO approval for. Cynthia will check with Logocomotion.
- 7. Winter Dance
 - In the process of securing the DJ and determining a theme. Looking at the cost of having CUSD cater versus purchasing from Costco or Sam's
- 8. Spirit Wear
 - The plan for winter spirit wear is to open sales on November 12 four three weeks until December 6 for orders and dispersing shirts after winter break.
- 9. Free Dress
 - It is confirmed that PTO can't donate to charities. There is potential to set up a grant process from the free dress funds. PTO will design the new program.
 - Outstanding question, will the free dress grant be for T-shirts only?
