Course Description

This choir is open to students with previous choral experience at the junior high level. Various choral literature will be studied using 3-part harmony and 4-part harmony. Placement in the Advanced Choir will be determined by audition. This choir will perform in the community and at various festivals. Attendance at all scheduled performances is mandatory.

For formal performances, uniforms are distributed at the beginning of the year. The students are responsible for the care of their uniform. The students provide black dress shoes and socks/tights for formal concerts. Uniforms must be cleaned upon return at the end of the school year to receive the final grade.

Late work

Out of courtesy to our families participating, please communicate as early as possible any concerns or conflicts with a particular date. Please email no later than 2 weeks before a concert to coordinate makeup assignments for students who arrange to do so. Not participating or communicating will result in a failing grade for the concert.

Students will have 1 school day for each absence to make up missing work, unless otherwise arranged.

*** All missing assignments are marked as "M" in Infinite Campus, resulting in a zero until turned in, which may result in a reduced grade for the completed assignment.

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. At the end of the first and second semesters, students will complete the CUSD Common Final. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

Quarter grades

Performances are an important part of the learning process for musicians and are graded events. Weekly assessment include class participation, application of music theory, completion of vocal part checks (singing correct pitches as part of a small group), and Memorization checks.

Although it is rare that homework is assigned, permission slips and assignments with due dates are considered homework.

At the end of 2nd and 4th Quarters a written final is given to all students in every graded class.

Semester grades

Semester grades are calculated using 45/45/10: Each quarter accounts for 45% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 10%.
