Student Responsibilities

Student Expectations:

1. Come to class prepared and on time. This includes:

Bringing your laptop fully charged every day. Being in your seat and having your agenda, pencil, and other materials out and ready by the time the bell rings.

- 2. Put forth your best effort and have a positive attitude. Be authentic and genuine.
- 3. Ask for help when you need it (attend tutoring, etc.)
- 4. Respect school rules as well as others and their property.
- 5. Follow the school dress code.
- 6. Profanity is forbidden.
- 7. Unless required by a medical condition, there should be no food or drink during class with the exception of a water bottle with a securely closed lid. If a student is eating/drinking something other than water during class, they will be asked to throw/put it away. Gum is not allowed.

- 9. Leaving class: Students must use a pass to leave the classroom unless called out by the office or another teacher. Students will sign out on the class log before leaving and upon entering the room again.
- 10. Cheating/Plagiarism will not be tolerated, this includes AI (artificial intelligence) generated material.
- 11. Be authentic, respectful, productive, and empathetic to one another!
- ~The classroom management plan will use the following interventions when behavior falls short of expectations: verbal reminder of expectations, student/teacher conference, parent call/email home, removal from an activity or the classroom, reflection form, assignment of lunch or after school detention, and parent/administration contact.~

Late work

Late work will be graded as such:

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.
