Prediction (predict type of text structure).

**practiced reading a decodable book in the Spalding Readers Series

In Math we:

**worked on subtracing 10 using a # line and introduced tally and pictographs.

In Writing we:

** students completed a circle map filled with ideas about a topic (their ocean occupant). Then took the ideas from our class tree map including the conjunction "and" and the pronoun "They." They also incorporated adjectives.

Then created sentences:

Ex. Crabs have sharp claws and pinchers

Sea Turtles can lay eggs and

do not have teeth

Jellyfish have tentacles

and

no brain

Whales are mammals and

warm-blooded

In Social Sciences:
