Discuss what their job entails. • Play a game at home where a parent tells you the responsibilities of a job and you have to guess what job your parent is describing. • Discuss what parents do when they are off from work and parents tend to the responsibilities at home such as: washing the dishes, vacuuming, gardening, etc. These activities involve a parent working to complete the activity. • Discuss with a parent items that you need in life that are important to you in order to live, such as water, food, etc. Afterwards discuss what you would like to have and items that you want such as candy and toys but talk about how these items are not necessary to have in order to live. • Ask a parent to look into their pockets and take out any change or dollars and discuss how much each coin or dollar is worth and name each coin or dollar bill. • Check out some book from the Library about various astronauts who explored space.
