Course Overview

Course Description

ENG705 Honors Language Arts 7 (One Year): This standards-based course is designed for students above grade level in reading comprehension and writing. In writing instruction, emphasis will be placed on the 6+1 traits of writing: ideas and content, word choice, organization, sentence fluency, voice, conventions, and format. Students will write summaries, expository essays, and literary responses that contain effective introductory and summary statements and fully develop the main ideas with details, facts, examples, and descriptions. Students will also learn to analyze literature by introducing various literary elements in poetry, short stories, plays, and novels.

Advanced Placement (AP) / International Baccalaureate (IB) / Dual Enrollment
