English Grammar Connection: You often use **pronouns** with **commands** to direct the action of the **verb** at someone or something. For both affirmative and negative commands in English, you place pronouns *after* the verb.

after → **Give me** the ball. *attached* → **Déme** la pelota. *after* → Don't **touch them**. *before* → No **los toque**.

In Spanish, the placement of pronouns depends on whether a **command** is **affirmative** or **negative**.

Here's how:

In **affirmative commands**, you *attach* **object pronouns** to the end of the **verb**.

attached →
Affirmative: **Llévenos** al supermercado.
Take us to the supermarket.

Ponganlas en la mesa.
Put them on the table.

Note that when a pronoun is attached to an affirmative command of two syllables or more, the stressed vowel carries an accent.

In **negative commands**, you place **object pronouns** *before* the **verb** and after **no**.

before →
Negative: **No le venda** esta camisa.
Don't sell her this shirt.

No lo prueben.
Don't taste it.
