Part of Speech	Definitions	Example Words
<b>Adjective</b>	a word describing a noun or pronoun	agreeable, brave, calm, yellow, eager, faithful, gentle, old, huge, happy, lovely
<p><u>Examples in sentences:</u>            He writes <b>meaningless</b> letters.            This shop is much <b>nicer</b>.            She wore a <b>beautiful</b> dress.            Ben is an <b>adorable</b> baby.            Linda's hair is <b>gorgeous</b>.</p> <p>This glass is <b>breakable</b>.            I met a <b>homeless</b> person in NY.            They live in a <b>beautiful</b> house.            Lisa is wearing a <b>sleeveless</b> shirt today.            This soup is not <b>edible</b>.</p>		
<b>Adverb</b>	a word that describes how or when a verb is done can also modify an adjective, or another adverb	awkwardly, loudly, carefully, happily, gracefully, quietly, hungrily, quickly, soon, really, so, well, now, finally
<p><u>Examples in sentences:</u>            I am going to <b>quickly</b> run home.            She <b>happily</b> hummed as she worked.            She <b>always</b> arrives early.            He drives <b>carefully</b>.            They go <b>everywhere</b> together.</p> <p>He walked <b>slowly</b> home.            I am <b>so</b> excited to see you <b>soon</b>!            She eats <b>slowly</b>.            It is <b>terribly</b> hot.</p>
