## Apostrophe Rules

Rule #1: Do NOT use for numbers that are plural nouns.

- Example: I grew up in the 1990s. (not 1990's)

<u>Rule #2</u>: Do NOT use for capital letters that are plural nouns or abbreviations.

- Example: We learned our ABCs. (not ABC's) Jim sells R.V.s (not R.V.'s)

Rule #3: DO use for contractions in the place of missing letters.

- Example: you're (you are) don't (do not)

<u>Rule #4</u>: DO use 's to show possession when something belongs to one person or thing.

- Example: the hat's feather Jenny's bike the child's mother

<u>Rule #5</u>: DO use after the plural s to show possession when something belongs to more than one person or thing. Make the noun plural first, then add the apostrophe.

- Example: the girls' room; the children's father; the dogs' toys

Rule #6: DO use 's to show possession of a name that ends in s.

- Example: Mr. Jones's files; Texas's weather

Rule #7: Its and it's are special cases.

its = something belongs to it

it's = contraction for it is or it has

- Example: The dog wagged its tail. It's going to be warm today! It's been a long time.
