<p>Imagery—words or phrases that appeal to one or more of the five senses</p>	<p><b>Example:</b> The sweet smell of freshly baked apple pie filled the air. The car squeaked every time I hit a bump in the road.</p>
<p>Symbolism—a figure of speech where an object, person, or situation has another (deeper) meaning other than its literal meaning</p>	<p><b>Example:</b> The mockingjay pin that Katniss wears is a symbol of rebellion.</p>
<p>Hyperbole—exaggerated statements or claims not meant to be taken literally</p>	<p><b>Example:</b> I'm so hungry that I'm going to die. When he popped out at me, I seriously jumped ten feet in the air! This is the best thing that's ever happened to anyone, ever.</p>
<p>Onomatopoeia—the formation of a word from a sound associated with what is name</p>	<p><b>Example:</b> Pop! Tick-tock. Zip. Sizzle! Moo. Vroom! Bang! La la la. Chirp. Hahahahaha!</p>
<p>Oxymoron—a figure of speech that is a combination of seemingly contradictory words</p>	<p><b>Example:</b> Jumbo shrimp, working vacation</p>
