English 102 students will learn research techniques for a critical analysis paper and critique two major novels and a play. #### Late work

Homework/Attendance Policies:

Late Work: Students who turn in work late will receive 10% off the first day, 30% the second day, and 50% after that.

Excused absences: You have as many days to make up work for an excused absence as days missed, except in the case of excessive absences or required project assignments. For larger or extended assignments absence will not be an excuse for turning in the work late. Test make-up must be set-up between the student and teacher immediately after missing a test.

Unexcused absences: Unexcused absences, if discovered, may result in the unexcused work having a dropped or lowered score thereby having a negative impact on the student's overall grade. Unresolved absences (ones not called in) are considered unexcused.

## **Assessments and Assignments**

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.
