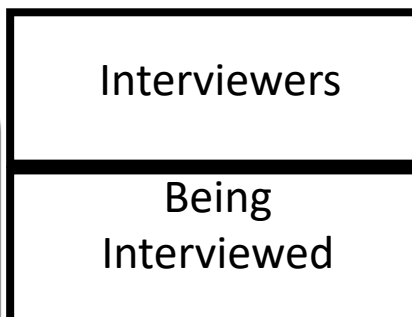


# SPEED INTERVIEWS

1. Give each student a notecard with their name on top.
2. Set-up the room as either a circle inside a circle or a straight line with desks or tables.
3. The students on the inside circle are being interviewed and the students on the outside circle have interview questions. If you are using a straight line, one side will be be students being interviewed and the other side will be students with interview questions.
4. Students on the inside circle will be answering interview questions to the best of their ability.
5. The rounds will last two minutes. One minute to answer questions and one minute to discuss.
6. The student with the interview questions will tell the interviewee what they did well and what they need to work on. They will write notes on that student's index card.
7. Have the students on the inside rotate when complete.
8. Once the interviewees have answered each question, have the students switch. Interviewers now become interviewees and vice versa.
