Project Guidelines

Here are the items you MUST purchase. (Check each item off once you finish it!):

- _____ 3. Take 1 family vacation (all expenses must be included in total cost: hotel, airfare, meals, transportation, spending money, etc)
- _____ 4. One car or vehicle
- _____ 5. One charitable donation (friends, families, & pets do not qualify to receive donations!)

Your grand total may not add up to more than \$1,000,000. (But you want to spend as much of it as possible!) This project is designed to help you plan for your future, build your math skills, and have some fun while researching! Try to think of your future when spending your money! Although a part of the real world, you are NOT required to pay taxes, closing fees, or other expenses for this project. (You are fortunate in this way!)

Other Rules for this project:

1. For your vacation, include all expenses.
2. Your house cannot cost over \$300,000. Use a realty website and find a home that is currently for sale that you would like. Include all information about the house on its expense page.
3. Include an informational page for each purchase you make. (If you find it on a website, print off information on the item. If you find it in a Flyer or sales ad, include the ad.)
4. You may not purchase more than three (3) of the same item
5. Use the enclosed tracking sheet to total up your expenses. Make sure to calculate your grand total (\$1,000,000)
6. Write checks for every purchase you make. Make sure to update your Tracking Sheet with each debit (or deduction) from your total amount.
7. Design an attractive cover for your project and staple together all informational pages of your project.

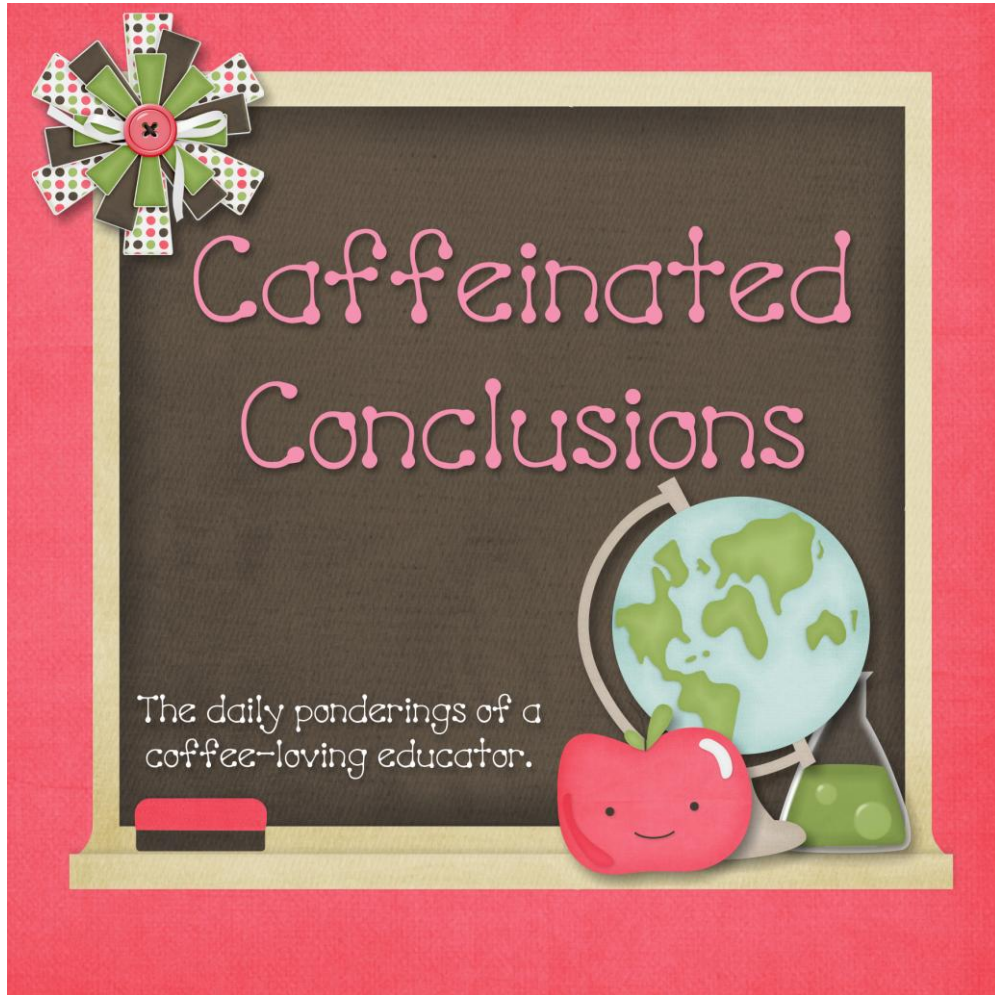
