Some missed work can not be made up and missed instruction can lead to a student falling behind.

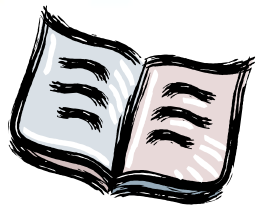


# Grades

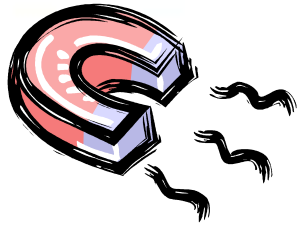

**Charlotte Patterson Elementary will implement Second Step Curriculum starting second quarter. Second Step is a research-based social-emotional learning curriculum that was created by Committee for Children.**

***What does Second Step teach?***

K-5th grade Units: Skills for Learning, Empathy, Emotion Management, Problem Solving, Skills for Learning.

6th grade Units: Mindsets and Goals, Values and Friendships, Thoughts, Emotions and Decisions, Serious Peer Conflicts.

***Why is social-emotional learning so important?***

"Social-emotional learning (SEL) is the process through which children and adults can better understand, manage, and express emotions and empathy, develop positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. SEL curricula teach children techniques that help them gain confidence, set and achieve positive goals, collaborate well, and navigate the world more effectively—adding a highly valuable dimension to education in the classroom."

***How is it taught?***

It is taught in the classroom by the general education teacher. Lessons will be twenty minutes per day. The lessons are taught using words, pictures, videos, and/or audio. Students are able to practice the concepts through skill practice, group discussion, individual writing, or partner work.

\*Home links are sent home so that you may review and practice the concepts with your student.

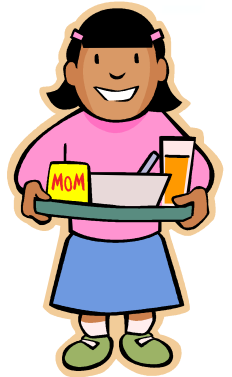

Arizona law ARS 43-1089.01 enables taxpayers a tax credit contribution of up to \$400.00 per calendar year if filing status is Married, filing Joint Return; \$200.00 per calendar year if filing status is Single or Head of Household; and, \$200.00 per calendar year if filing status is Married filing separate return — for contributions that fund extracurricular activities in public schools. A tax credit is a full refund, not a deduction.

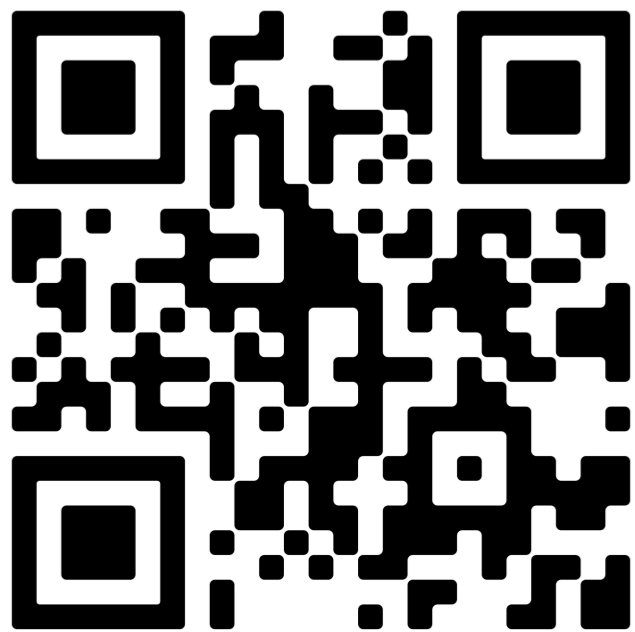
