Student Responsibilities

Tardies:

You must be seated in your assigned seat before the bell ring ends or you will be marked tardy. The following are the consequences for tardiness:

- 1st tardy: verbal reminder/warning
- 2nd tardy: tardy slip will be sent home and required a parent signature

- 3rd tardy: your parent or guardian will be contacted and you will serve a lunch detention the following day

- 4th tardy (including any thereafter): written referral

If you accumulate 4 or more tardies within a semester, extra credit opportunities will no longer be available for the semester grade.

Behavioral Consequences:

All consequences are at the teacher's discretion based on the severity of the offense.

- First: a conference with the student/ warning
- Second: contact with parent/guardians
- Third: referral to administration

Late work

Absences:

- It is the student's responsibility to obtain any missed work and notes. In case of an absence, check the "Absent Wall" or with a classmate to see what notes/assignments were missed. Warm Ups are expected to be made up.

- Any work due or assigned on a day in which an unexcused absence occurs will result in zero credit for that assignment.

Please Note: if a long-term assignment has been assigned prior to the absence the due date stands. - Extensions may be granted on a case-by-case basis depending on the circumstances.

Late work:

- Homework is due on its due date at the beginning of class (or time scheduled in Google - - if outside of class time).

- If an assignment is (1) one day late, it is worth 50%. If it is two (2) days late, it will receive a zero.

- Long term assignments will lose 25% of the grade for every day late. After four (4) days late, it will receive a grade of zero.

- Incomplete or illegible work will not be accepted.

Labs:

Biology is a laboratory science class. Students must complete labs. If a lab is missed due to an excused absence, then the labs must be made up after school and on specified lab make up days. Due to lab materials, labs need to be made up in a timely manner.

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

Quarter grades

Quarter grades will be calculated from students' test scores and quizzes, approximately 45% of overall grade, lab reports/projects, approximately 35% of overall grade, as well as homework at approximately 20% of the overall grade. Grades are based on weighted categories per quarter and calculated into a percentage. Letter grades are based on the following percentages:

100% - 90% = A 80% - 89% = B 70% - 79% = C 60% - 69% = D 50% - 59% = F

Semester grades are calculated as follows: First Quarter = 40% Second Quarter = 40% Final Exam = 20%

Semester grades

Semester grades are calculated using 40/40/20: Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
