Ask teacher's permission before going into cabinets or taking tools & supplies. Graffiti will not be tolerated. Leave the classroom in the same state as you entered it. \*\*Throwing any material in the art room is an automatic disciplinary referral.\*\*
- \* Effort. Students are expected to participate fully in all classroom activities. No student is expected to be an accomplished artist upon entry into the class. The expectation is that the student will develop skills, through practice, during the year. Students will use all class time for ART class work only. Try your best!
- \* Behavior in the classroom. Students are expected to follow all school rules in the classroom. No behavior that endangers students and those around them as well as putting creative endeavors at risk is acceptable. All students must sign out & have a written pass when leaving or entering the classroom during instruction time.
- \* Food. School policy states that food, gum, and beverages are not allowed in the classroom. Students are not to bring those items into the classroom, with the exception of a clear contained water bottle.
  - \* Preparation. BE ON TIME. You will bring your sketchbook, pen, and pencil to class every day.
- \* Communication. If you are having a problem with this class do not assume that I know. It is your responsibility to communicate with me, so that you will have a successful experience. I cannot help with what I do not know.
- \* Cell phone policy: Students are permitted to use technology when the teacher has given permission. All phones are to be upside-down on the table and out of student view or in the wall phone pocket holder during work time. NO VIDEO watching, texting or social media will be allowed during instructional time. When working, students may earn the privilege of listening to their own music with ONE earbud/Air Pod in. See student handbook for technology policies and procedures.

### Late work

Projects are to be finished by the given due date and a photo of the completed work submitted to the Google classroom assignment by midnight of the date due. -2 points per day will be deducted on unexcused late work. Please communicate difficulties/emergencies as needs arise.

### Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

### **Quarter grades**

### Semester grades

Semester grades are calculated using 40/40/20: Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
