Course Description: Basic grammar, pronunciation, and vocabulary of the Spanish language. Includes the study of the Spanish-speaking cultures. Practice of listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills.

Course Competencies:

- 1. Demonstrate comprehension of written and oral passages that include biographical information, basic questions and descriptions, short narratives, brief dialogues, survival vocabulary, and current events.
- 2. Compose written passages that include biographical information, basic questions and descriptions, short narratives, brief dialogues, survival vocabulary, and current events.
- 3. Ask and answer oral questions to satisfy basic needs, express biographical information, provide short descriptions, and participate in very simple conversations.
- 4. Identify cultural aspects of the target language.

Attendance:

Your presence in class is essential to your success. Unlike some disciplines where you might be able to get lecture notes or simply read the material that was covered in order to be caught up when you have missed a class, a foreign language class is different. The speaking and listening in Spanish that happens during the class period cannot be made up. If you are absent, you will find missing work in the blue shelving box located on the north wall of the classroom. You will receive a MISSING grade in the grade book, and it will count as a zero until late work is turned in. You have ALL quarter to turn in late work, but it is subject to a 50% total grade score.

Homework will be assigned WHEN NECESSARY. The completion of these homework assignments will help prepare you for success on the test and quizzes. DO NOT COPY! It just wastes your time and mine!

Tests / Quizzes – Assessments will be given about once a week in order to determine what each student has learned. Tests and quizzes make up a large portion of the overall grade; therefore, it is very important to perform the best that you can. Writing and spelling is an important part of the quizzes and tests.

Late work

Late work will be accepted until the last day of the quarter. After one week, there will be a 50% late fee deduction. NEVER accept a ZERO in the grade book.

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.
