<u>Materials:</u> 3-ring math binder, 3 subject dividers, lined paper, graph paper, pencils, pens, and a **GRAPHING CALCULATOR**. (It is <u>strongly</u> suggested that each student purchase a graphing calculator for home/class use in ALGEBRA 2.. RECOMMENDED: TI-83, TI-83plus, **TI-84 CE or TI-84 plus**... NOT RECOMMENDED: Casios, TI-89s and TI-Nspires CAS.)

<u>Attendance</u>: Attendance is required during every scheduled class period. The only way a student will be allowed to make up work is if his/her absence was excused through the attendance office. After 9 absences, per semester, a student may be dropped from the class. During virtual learning, students who are not able to attend virtual in-person lessons during scheduled class periods, must email the teacher at nielsen.thomas@cusd80.com. Student is responsible for watching videos of missed lessons and all work will be due at the assigned times.

<u>Virtual Attendance</u>: Attendance is based on engagement. If a student is not present for synchronous instruction and does not complete the asynchronous/alternative assignment for the daily class meeting, then the student is considered absent. Teachers will contact attendance clerks once a student is determined to be absent.

<u>Virtual Learning Expectations</u>: Each class meeting day, students will check Google Classroom, and will attend class virtually by clicking on the Google Meets link (found in Google Classroom) at the start of the period for that class. Students should be checking their gmail (<u>@gse.cusd80.com</u>) for updates and notifications.

<u>Tardies:</u> Any student, who is not in their seat prepared to begin working when the late bell rings, will be considered tardy, unless they have a signed pass. When a student is tardy, he/she will be assigned to After School Detention (ASD) from 2:30-3:30 to be served the following day. After 5 tardies, a referral will be written.

Homework:

Even though most homework will be done on-line, ALL Homework will:

Be completed ON PAPER in pencil and corrected in pen whether we are in person or virtual. Include the appropriate work to make the method of solution clear or no credit.

A list of answers is not acceptable.

My.hrw.com assignments are due at the beginning of the next class period. The due date in My.hrw.com WILL BE DIFFERENT. When in doubt use the calendar due dates.

All problems must be attempted.

Be kept in an organized 3-ringed binder.

Be checked or collected during class.

NO unexcused late work will be given **credit**. However, all assignments must be completed to participate with their group for any Group Tests.

Makeup Work:

- 1. The student has an equal number of days to make up any missing assignments, tests, quizzes, or projects equal to the number of days their absences were excused (students will not be reminded that they are missing work).
- 2. It is the student's responsibility to turn in the missing assignments by the prescribed time, or he/she will receive a zero (this also applies for tests & quizzes).
- 3. Tests, quizzes, & some class assignments can only be made up after school.

ASD:

Students will be assigned After School Detention for unexcused tardies and incomplete assignments. If the student does not come to ASD on their assigned day, a referral may be sent to administration.

Tutoring hours:

Tuesday and Fridays after school 2:30-3:30, additional hours are available upon request.

Class Expectations:

In my class I expect excellent behavior and participation, including a "community"-type atmosphere where mathematics is discussed and mistakes are made as part of the normal learning process. An atmosphere of mutual respect where you respect my right to teach and I respect your right to learn is required. All school rules and policies are to be followed, but I expect that you demonstrate common sense. There are many occasions where stopping to think before you respond will create a better learning environment for everyone. Since students learn best by being an active participant, it is required that all students participate in all class activities.

<u>Classroom Rules and Consequences (Virtually and In Person):</u>

- 1. **Be prepared** everyday with pencil and eraser, pen, loose-leaf/notebook paper, binder, and completed homework. It also means that you have taken care of personal business before coming to class.
- 2. **Be respectful** to yourself, your classmates and me. This also includes having respect for any property or belongings that are not owned by you personally. No put-downs or cursing.
- 3. **Follow directions** the **FIRST** time they are given.
- 4. **During instruction, raise your hand to speak.** Enter the room and work quietly.
- 5. Follow ALL school rules.

Quarter grades will be broken down as follows:

<u>Honors:</u> It is *imperative* that students stay on top of their homework and assignments. This class is rigorous and fast paced at times, and students are expected to seek help if they need it. If at the first progress report, 4 weeks into the quarter, a student is carrying a grade of 69% or lower a parent/teacher/student conference will be requested to formulate a plan for the student's success. At this time, the student may be transferred to an on-level class.
