Earth Science - Solar Eclipse Monday, April 8 On Monday, April 8, 2024, a total solar eclipse will traverse North America, passing over Mexico, the United States, and Canada.

According to NASA, following this event, the next total solar eclipse visible from the contiguous U.S. will occur on August 23, 2044.

During a total solar eclipse, the Moon moves between the Sun and Earth, completely obscuring the Sun's face. As a

result, the sky darkens, resembling dawn or dusk. A partial solar eclipse occurs when the alignment of the Earth, Moon, and Sun is not perfectly straight, allowing part of the Sun to remain visible, creating a crescent-like appearance. April I, 2024

Residents of Arizona will witness a partial solar eclipse (approximately 70% obscuration of the sun) see timeline below.

10:08:22 AM	Partial Eclipse Begins - The moment the edge of the Moon touches the edge of the sun is called first contact.
11:20:01 AM	Maximum Eclipse - The deepest point of the eclipse, with the Sun at its most hidden.
12:35:02 PM	Partial Eclipse Ends - The edge of the Moon leaves the edge of the Sun.
