- To be successful students in Symphonic Orchestra should participate fully in class rehearsals, practice their instruments at home, and perform with the ensemble at concerts and adjudicated festivals.
- Students will have an opportunity to perform at Solo & Ensemble Festival and to audition for Regional Honor Orchestra.
- Students should display a positive attitude about individual practice and group rehearsal, especially when asked to learn new/advanced musical techniques and playing styles.
- Students should not use cell phones in class unless requested to do so by the instructor for research purposes.

Late work

- Some written assignments will be given in class (music theory related). Be sure to make up late work due to excused absence within the week.
- All students are required to attend performances. Missed performances will result in lowered grade until make-up assignment designated by the instructor is completed.

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

Quarter grades

- Individual playing tests will be given once per quarter throughout the school year and will function both as a letter grade and chair placement for the quarter concert. Playing tests include selections from current repertoire as well as scales/arpeggios.
- Written tests will be given to check understanding of music theory presented in class.
- Practicing your instrument is homework in Orchestra class. Each student is expected to practice a minimum of four days a week. Practice will be graded by way of in-class practice checks and reflections to monitor their home preparation.

Semester grades

Semester grades are calculated using 40/40/20: Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
