Student Responsibilities

- Students in Chamber Orchestra should participate fully in class rehearsal, sectionals, and performances.
- Students will prepare their music by practicing at home.
- Students will have an opportunity to perform at Solo & Ensemble Festival and to audition for Regional and All-State Orchestra.
- Private lessons are highly recommended at this level.
- Students are responsible to learn their individual part of the performance literature.
- Students will work together to achieve musical goals in small and large ensemble rehearsal.
- Students should not use cell phones in class unless asked to use them by the instructor for research and common communication purposes.

Late work

- Some written quizzes and composing assignments will be given in class (music theory/composition related). Be sure to make up late work/quizzes due to excused absence within a week.
- All students are required to attend performances. Unexcused performance absences will result in a student's grade being lowered two letter grades. See teacher for performance replacement assignment in the case of unavoidable absence (sickness etc.).

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/quardians seven days before student contact.

Quarter grades

- Individual playing test evaluations will happen several times during each semester.
- Student "chairs" are determined by playing test grades and teacher evaluation of playing skill and leadership ability during ensemble rehearsals.
- Written guizzes are administered to check student understanding of music theory presented in class.
- At-home practice is required. In-class practice checks and reflections will show students' practice

preparation.

Semester grades

Semester grades are calculated using 40/40/20: Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
