People We Meet

Big Idea: The workers in my community help everyone. **Concepts:** Community workers, jobs, and careers, helping others

Theme Vocabulary: doctor, firefighter, librarian, mail carrier, police officer, work, workers

Subitizing: Subitizing is the act of instantly recognizing a quantity without having to count each item in the quantity one by one. Subitizing is critical in building numeracy skills that support abstract umber concepts and strategies in later years. There are two different types of subitizing: perceptual and conceptual. Perceptual subitizing is when a child is able to automatically see a given quantity, usually no more than three at this age. Conceptual subitizing is when the child has to mentally rearrange a quantity into recognizable patterns before automatically seeing the given quantity.

Mighty Magnets: In *Mighty Magnets*, children classify magnets by magnetic strength. First, they observe a large horseshoe magnet pick up a pile of not one, but many paperclips. Can another magnet with a different size and shape do the same thing? An investigation about comparing magnetic strengths
