#### What to look forward to next week:

#### Theme:

- Our Community: Things That Move
- Push and Pull Children will learn about the push and pull of magnetic force.
- Investigating Numbers 1 5: recognize and read numerals 1 to 5
- Fundations: H
- Focus: Brown; Rectangle

#### Things That Move

**Big Idea:** Transportation is for doing jobs and getting around my community.

**Concepts:** Transportation, machines, how things move, safety rules

**Theme Vocabulary:** vehicle, transportation, safety, travel, traffic, passenger, driver

**Push and Pull:** In *Push and Pull*, children experience the "push" and "pull" of magnetic force. They use a bar magnet to move a magnetic toy train both forward and backward along a track. Turning the magnets one way pushes the train forward; turning the magnet the other way pulls the train back. Children try to use magnetic force to move their train all the way across the table.

Recognize and read numerals 1 to 5: For children to understand what a number represents; they must first be familiar with the quantity aspect of number. This follows from a natural progression of counting objects, to seeing pictorial quantities, to recognizing dot arrangements, to eventually linking these quantities to the number symbol, or numeral.
