Frank Narducci, Assistant Superintendent of Elementary Education, Dr. Strom, Assistant Superintendent of K-12 Educational Services, and Autumn Sample, Elementary Specialist, detailed the changes to the Move on When Reading (MOWR) program.

1.02 Chandler Early College, Chandler Online Academy and Hill Learning Academy Updates

Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses support students earning industry recognized certifications where applicable. In the CUSD Medical Professions program, students are working towards earning their Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) or Licensing Nursing Assistant (LNA) credentials. As part of the nursing assistant training program, students must participate in a minimum of 40 hours of clinical experiences.

The Clinical Affiliation Agreement offers eligible Medical Professions II students at Perry High School the opportunity to participate in clinical experiences at Montecito Post-Acute Care and Rehabilitation at 51 South 48th Street, Mesa, AZ 85206. This Agreement is for a term of one (1) year, and will be automatically renewed for an unlimited number of renewal terms of one (1) year, unless written notice of termination is given by either Party.

6. Action Items

6.01 Consideration and Possible Adoption of a Resolution Providing for all Matters Related to the Refunding of Certain Bonds of the District by the Sale and Issuance of Refunding Bonds of the District including Delegation to the Superintendent and Chief Financial Officer to Determine Certain Matters Related Thereto

Interest rates remain near historically low levels providing the District an opportunity to refinance a portion of its outstanding bond debt for debt service savings. Approximately \$16.5 million of District bonds issued in 2008 and 2011, currently outstanding at interest rates ranging from 4.00% to 5.00% can be refinanced today at a true interest cost (TIC) of approximately 2.0%. It is estimated that the refinancing will save district taxpayers approximately \$1.2 million in bond debt service over the next eight to nine years, depending on prevailing interest rates at the time of the bond sale (est. early December, 2017). A refinancing program of this size might normally be added to a future new money bond sale by the District. However, current tax reform bills in Congress, if enacted, could prevent this type of tax-exempt refinancing after this calendar year. Therefore, the District Chief Financial Officer believes it is financially prudent to move expeditiously to complete the bond sale prior to year-end to be able to achieve the savings. Passage of tax reform this year remains highly uncertain at this time.

The Authorizing Resolution calls for the possible issuance of a not-to-exceed principal amount of refunding bonds of \$17.0 million to allow flexibility to adjust to market conditions at the time of sale. The Refunding bonds will maintain the same term as the bonds to be refinanced.

Governing Board action will allow the District's investment banker, Stifel, and bond counsel, Greenberg Traurig, to proceed expeditiously with preparing the legal documentation and offering documents necessary to complete this advantageous sale on behalf of the District. Should the Board elect to go forward with the refunding, staff will work diligently with its finance team and bond counsel to close the transaction prior to the end of the calendar year.

The Chandler Unified Transportation team is recommending Canyon State Bus Sales for our General Education & Special Education transportation needs for FY 2018. In working to create a more efficient and positive experience for our students, we need to replace some of our older buses and add to our existing fleet. Canyon State is a distributor of Blue Bird buses and hold 50% share of the market. Canyon State has been exemplary in regards to all vehicle parts and service needs.

Language in the chapter establishes that school districts may evaluate the transcripts of transfer students for the assignment of credit pursuant to A.R.S. 15-701.1. Chandler School District recommended adopting the policies as proposed by ASBA. Approval will be requested at the December 13, 2017 board meeting.
