6. Consent Agenda

6.01 Out of State Student Travel Preplanning

Out of state field trip pre-planning forms for ACP-O, BHS and HHS were provided. Following Governing Board pre-approval, the Superintendent will monitor trip arrangements before providing final approval.

6.02 Donations

Requested approval of the items generously donated to Chandler Schools totaling \$41,867.78.

6.03 Monetary Gifts

6.04 Fuel for Yellow and White Fleet

The District has been utilizing the City of Chandler Contract FA9-405-2707 for fuel provided by Western Refining Southwest, Inc. This contract will expire 3/31/18. City of Chandler issued a new RFP with SAVE language and included the District's fuel usage to obtain more competitive pricing. The City was the lead on the solicitation. On December 7, 2017, the City awarded to Western Refining Southwest, Inc. for dispensed fuel, Senergy Petroleum LLC for dispensed fuel and bulk fuel, and Supreme Oil Co. for bulk fuel only. The District only utilizes the cardlock system for dispensed fuel and does not require on-site bulk fuel delivery. Both Western Refining and Senergy Petroleum provide cardlock fuel locations.

The contract will begin April 1, 2018 through March 31, 2021 with the option of up to two (2) additional three-year extensions. Should all extensions be utilized, this contract would expire 3/31/2027 resulting in a nine-year contract and will be presented each year for Board approval as part of the extended contract list. Recommended approval to contract with Western Refining Southwest, Inc. to provide dispensed fuel through the cardlock system per the City of Chandler RFP AS8-405-3826 in an estimated amount of \$850,000 for 2017-2018.

6.05 Student Discipline

As to Student L.T., the Hearing Officer recommended expulsion in his December 18, 2017 Recommendation. A Stipulated Agreement between Parents of Student and the District, executed on December 13, 2017, specifically requested that the Hearing Officer make his recommendation based solely on evidentiary submissions of the parties, waived Student's right to a hearing, and provided that Parents and Student would not appeal the Hearing Officer's recommendation.

7.02 Purchase Support Fleet Vehicles

Recommended approval to purchase the following non-student vehicles for a total of \$227,748.59 from the Arizona State Contract number ADSPO12-016662 due to growth of Support Services, Security, Warehouse, and Transportation. This purchase has been budgeted using district capital.

- 1 F150 Super Crew 4 x 2 Long Bed to replace vehicle #87 for support services- \$23,619.36
- 1 Ford Fusion F150 Regular Cab Long Bed to replace vehicle #144 for security \$19,406.00
- 1 2018 International Freightliner Box Truck to replace vehicle #83 \$98,000.00
- 1 2017 Ford Explorer for transportation and district usage \$27,827.87
- 1 2018 8 Passenger Ford Transit Van for usage for school/team reservations \$28,899.87

8. Information Items

8.01 English Language Arts Curriculum

Chandler Unified School District has not adopted a new curriculum for English Language Arts in 7th-12th grade since 2006. A request for information (RFI) was submitted in the fall of 2017 in alignment with ARS 15-722. After receiving responses to the RFI, Chandler Unified School District Curriculum Department worked with stakeholder groups to evaluate options against a standardized rubric. While CUSD is continuing to work through contract negations, the top two vendors, Pearson Perspectives and HMH Collections will be placed on display for the 60-day public review period at the Instructional Resource Center. After completion of the public review and contract negations, CUSD will present solutions for new curriculum in English Language Arts for 7th-12th grade to the Governing Board. The cost of this curriculum purchase is budgeted.

8.02 World Language Curriculum

Chandler Unified School District has not adopted a new curriculum for World Languages in 7th-12th grade since 2004. A request for information (RFI) was submitted in the fall of 2017 in alignment with ARS 15-722. The RFI included Spanish, French, American Sign Language, German and Mandarin. After receiving responses to the RFI, Chandler Unified School District Curriculum department worked with stakeholder groups to evaluate options against a standardized rubric. While CUSD is continuing to work through contract negotiations, the top four vendors, Pearson, EMC Paradigm, Wayside and Vista will be placed on display for the 60-day public review period at the Instructional Resource Center. After completion of the public review and contract negations, CUSD will present solutions for new curriculum in World Languages for 7th-12th grade to the Governing Board. The cost of this curriculum is budgeted.

8.03 New Director Position Proposed

A new job description to provide District-wide leadership in the design and implementation of an equity framework is presented for information. The purpose of an equity framework is twofold. First, the framework will support and advance a culture of equity, diversity and inclusion across the District. Second, the framework will build the capacity of staff to student achievement and close opportunity gaps. After any recommended revisions, the position description will be included on the February 28, 2018 board meeting agenda for approval.

8.04 Policy Revisions

The Chandler School District is proposing a minor change to a couple of policies regarding the evaluation of support staff. The current language in Policy GDB - Support Staff Contracts and Compensation and GDO - Evaluation of Support Staff Members specifies the timeline as "workdays". The recommendation is to change the policy language from 180 workdays to 180 calendar days to maximize the use of the Business/Employee software to provide automated tracking and reminders to supervisors. In practice, this change will reduce the probationary period for new employees; however, 180 calendar days is a reasonable probationary period and should not negatively impact the evaluative outcome. These changes will be presented for approval at the February 28, 2018 board meeting.

8.05 CUSD Board Agenda Roadmap

Board members discussed upcoming events.

8.06 Superintendent Comments

Dr. Casteel announced that CUSD had three state championship soccer games and the induction ceremony for the 2018 Chandler Sports Hall of Fame all last weekend. Casteel girls won their first title, 2-1, over Yuma Catholic. Perry girls and ACP-Erie boys also had great years, finishing as state runners-up. Mike Woods, Hamilton High baseball coach, and Stephen Carsons, longtime Chandler High track coach and now an assistant at Hamilton, were inducted into the 2018 Chandler Sports Hall of Fame along with several students.

The CUSD student leadership Convention was held last Friday. Students showed off their tremendous school spirit, participated in activities and announced they raised more than \$12,000 for Fans Across America, which does so many great things for our community.

Sunday morning, the community came together for the Chandler Schools Boosters All-In 5K/one mile Fun Run to raise money and awareness for the collective boosters in CUSD.
