Minutes of a Regular Board Meeting of the Governing Board

Office of the Board Maricopa County, Arizona March 27, 2019 7:00 p.m.

1. Study Sessions - 5:30 pm

1.01 Social/Emotional Programming

Dr. Craig Gilbert, Assistant Superintendent of Secondary Education, opened by introducing Ken James, Executive Director of Educational Programs, and Brenda Ramos, Director of Counseling and Social Services. They, along with their team of Anne Cordasco, Assistant Director of Counseling and Social Services, Natasha Davis and Shea Dodson, District Social Workers, presented information on the social and emotional programs in the District. Since this is a new department this year, they reached out to other school districts and out-of-state models to learn how to best serve Chandler's student community. This year data was collected, which showed the need for attention to be on the whole child. The District has provided suicide training to health assistants, nurses, bus drivers and after school program personnel - people who come in direct contact with students and can help identify needs. Community partnerships have been formed, prevention efforts and parent education opportunities, as well as expanded opportunities for wellness learning and activities have been instituted. Each high school campus will have an additional social worker beginning with the 2019-20 school year to assist with the social/emotional needs of students.

4.01 Student Body President Comments

8.02 Supplemental Math Resource- Art of Problem Solving Grades 2-5

The Art of Problem Solving is a supplementary resource for math in grades 2-5 providing opportunities for students to apply math concepts in new ways that allow them to understand challenging concepts on a deeper level. Currently, this supplement is being piloted in a few classrooms at Knox Gifted Academy. The supplemental curriculum will be placed on display for the 60-day public review period for comment at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center starting March 28, 2019. After the 60-day review period for public comment, this curriculum will be presented for approval. The total cost for this supplemental digital subscription is \$35 per student per year. Any subscriptions purchased would be budgeted through site level funds.

Due to updates in the state standards for Social Sciences, a Request for Information to vendors for textbooks and resources was sent out December 20, 2018 for 7th and 8th grade courses. The identified publishers and titles are moving on to the junior high sites for review. The curriculum will be placed on display for the 60-day public review period for comment at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center starting March 28, 2019. After the 60-day review period for public comment, the final selection of textbooks will be presented for approval. Total cost will be available after identification of the final selections.
