6. Comments

6.01 Superintendent Comment

Dr. Casteel mentioned that Chandler Unified has completed day 12 since returning from Intersession. We are reinventing ourselves as we adapt to the circumstances of school closures. We have been methodical and deliberate in decision-making and continue to roll out information frequently to staff, students and families. We are trying not to overwhelm families. In addition, we are training teachers for our online approach. There are many unsung heroes working behind the scene helping us develop our approach to online learning through curriculum development, technology support for staff and students. Grading information has just been posted on our website.

Dr. Casteel pointed out a number of positive things that are occurring. The Community Education department is providing childcare for first responders at Hamilton High School. Food Services staff is doing everything in their power to make sure children 18 and under receive the food they need to stay nourished. Breakfast and lunch is being provided at seven sites from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm and three snack and dinner sites from 4-6:00 pm Monday through Friday. The community is very appreciative as evidenced by the 78,000 curbside meals served weekly.

There are so many challenges for everyone with the schools closing. Right now, our seniors are feeling a little lost - and that is completely understandable. This is not the way they envisioned closing out their senior year. We have purposely delayed final decisions related to end of year activities for a few more weeks so that we can monitor the status of this virus. However, our high schools are paying tribute to the senior class by displaying football stadium lights nightly at 8:20 pm (20:20 military time) for 20 minutes. Perry High School Principal Dan Serrano had the idea first and now it has caught on with all of our schools and even neighboring district high schools. Dr. Casteel thanked all the staff and parents for their support and understanding during this unprecedented time.

Chandler District is also working closely with the US Census Bureau and the cities and towns we serve to make sure our community is aware of the importance of participating in the US Census. The survey is online and only takes a few minutes to complete. Census results affect planning and funding for health care, education, infrastructure, employment training and much more. Anyone who hasn't completed the survey is encouraged to go to www.census.gov and do your part.

Dr. Casteel closed by wishing everyone good health, urging everyone in the community to continue to take precautions to keep yourselves healthy and hope for a speedy resolve.

David Evans thanked the staff and administration for facing the challenges of COVID-19 and complimented the great collaboration with the community by showing equity in providing services, meals for students who count on schools, the survey for technology needs, etc. showing how the staff is working hard to provide for our students.

Lindsay Love thanked the District, teachers and the community at large for mobilizing access. This situation is one that no one has been through. Some Equity concerns have been highlighted by this moment in time and will teach us how to move forward to better ourselves. CUSD is doing the best they can. Lindsay pointed out how spikes in domestic violence and child abuse is anticipated and suggested information be available on the District's website so families get the needed help and support.

Karen McGee complimented Mr. Fletcher on the work at the new high school, stating she walks by there every morning watching how the progress is coming along - it is looking good.

Lara Bruner thanked the staff stating how educators are adjusting and meeting the needs of every student. Amazing work happens every day.

Barb Mozdzen echoed the comments from other board members stating that CUSD has a fantastic staff and administration working very hard to ensure students and families are being taken care of. She encouraged the community to check on their neighbors to make sure they are okay and to offer a little kindness at this time.
