9.01 My World Interactive Geography 2019 Spanish Survey

My World Interactive Geography 2019 Spanish Survey materials are designed to teach Spanish language and World History to students participating in the Dual Language Immersion 7th grade World History course. The package includes an Online Learning System Classroom License for a maximum of 40 (5 gratis) student seats and one teacher (gratis) license for six academic years. The total cost of \$4,457.09 includes materials, online licensing, shipping and taxes and will be funded through the District Textbook budget.

The My World Interactive Geography 2019 Spanish Survey resources are published by Savvas and will be used by Dual Language Immersion teacher(s) to support language instruction and Social Science standards. In accordance with A.R.S. 15-721, the curriculum will be placed on display for the 60-day public review period for comment at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center starting on February 25, 2021.

9.02 <u>Early Childhood Education Textbook and Digital Resource Adoption - Early Childhood Education Career</u> <u>& Technical Education (CTE) Program</u>

The last CUSD Early Childhood Education (ECE) adoption was in 2006. The Arizona Department of Education ECE Technical Standards in Early Childhood were updated in 2016. The district recently moved through an ECE textbook adoption process in accordance with A.R.S. 15-721 and CUSD Policies IJJ and IJJ-R.

Four of five current ECE teachers reviewed and evaluated all textbooks submitted by the publishers. The committee is recommending the following two textbooks and their digital resources to move forward in the textbook and digital resource adoption process:

- Early Childhood Education 1 (ECE100): Child Development: Early Stages Through Age 12 Goodheart-Wilcox
- Early Childhood Education 2 (ECE 200): Working with Young Children Goodheart-Wilcox

The cost for the two textbooks and their digital resources is \$78,781.00 including tax and shipping. This will be funded through the District Textbook budget. In accordance with A.R.S. 15-721, the textbooks and their digital resources will be placed on display for the 60-day public review period for comment at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center starting February 25, 2021. After the 60-day review period for public comment, the textbooks and digital resources will be presented for approval.

9.03 <u>Medical Professions Textbook and Digital Resource Adoption - Nursing Services Career & Technical</u> Education (CTE) Program

The last CUSD Medical Profession's adoption was in 2017. To stay in compliance with the Arizona State Board of Nursing R4-19-801-(C)(6), the current textbook may not be older than 5 years from the date of publication. To meet this requirement, the district has recently moved through a nursing textbook adoption process in accordance with A.R.S. 15-721 and CUSD Policies IJJ and IJJ-R.

All Medical Professions teachers reviewed and evaluated all textbooks submitted by the publishers. The committee is recommending the following textbook and digital resources to move forward in the textbook adoption process:

- Medical Professions 1 & 2 (NUR300 & NUR400):
 - The Nursing Assistant Essentials for Holistic Care Goodheart-Wilcox

The cost for the textbooks and their digital resources is \$17,239.36 including tax and shipping. This will be funded through the District Textbook budget. In accordance with A.R.S. 15-721, the textbooks and digital resources will be placed on display for the 60-day public review period for comment at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center starting February 25, 2021. After the 60-day review period for public comment, the textbooks and their digital resources will be presented for approval.

CUSD is collaborating with the Arizona Department of Health and local pharmacies at Albertsons and Fry's to provide a second dose of Moderna vaccines to our staff, charter and private schools, and childcare providers on March 6th. We expect approximately 2,500 participants at Hamilton and Perry High Schools. Additionally, our partnership with Dignity Health and Maricopa County is providing CUSD staff their second dose of Pfizer vaccines at Chandler Gilbert Community College all month.

We have many success stories. In addition to our 64 National Merit Finalists, a fifth grader, Cayden Brenes of Jacobson Elementary, has qualified for the State Spelling Bee on March 20th. We are thrilled with the outcome of our students in a very challenging year.
