Kurt Rohrs, parent – discussed critical race theory and requested the board not add 1619 project to curriculum. These are political action and the teachers' union should not advocate these rights. Katie Nash, CEA president - thanked the board for supporting the vaccination pods and extending the COVID leave. With the Governor's order for schools to be back in-person after spring break, she asked the board to stay the course for the mask policy. She also asked to continue virtual meetings and mitigation strategies.

6.04 <u>Second Step Social-Emotional Digital Resource</u> (cont'd)

On July 10, 2019, the Governing Board approved Committee for Children's Second Step social-emotional curriculum print materials for grades K-6. On September 23, 2020, the Governing Board approved the Second Step digital resources for grades 7-8. Committee for Children is now offering the digital resource for Elementary as they are no longer providing the printed materials. The Curriculum and Instruction Department is requesting approval of the 5-Year Second Step Digital Program for use in grades K-8 beginning July 2021 and ending June 2026. The cost for the Second Step Grade K-8 Multi-Site Digital Program, 5-Year is \$209,233.33 including taxes and will be funded through the District textbook budget.

7.01 <u>Consideration and Possible Adoption of a Resolution Providing for all Matters Relating to the Sale and Issuance of School Improvement Bonds, Project of 2019, Series B (2021)</u>

Consideration and possible adoption of a resolution providing for all matters relating to the sale and issuance of School Improvement Bonds of the District including delegation to the Superintendent and Chief Financial Officer of the District to determine certain matters related thereto. The Resolution before the Governing Board authorizes the issuance of bonds of the District to raise funds for capital projects of the District. The Series 2020 Bonds are the second sale from the 2019 election.

The Resolution authorizes the District Administration to move forward with the steps needed to execute the bond transaction. The Board's approval puts the District in a position to execute the transaction when the timing is right, considering the District's need for project dollars and the conditions in the tax-exempt bond market. At the time the District is ready to sell the bonds, the professional financing team will analyze market conditions and work with District administration to execute the transaction in a manner that will minimize the District's bond interest cost. District administration recommends flexibility to execute the transaction this fiscal year as we work to meet the District's need for project funds, retire an existing lease-purchase and determine an appropriate time to sell the bonds. Open to questions of District staff or Stifel bankers Randie Stein and Grant Hamill.

Approve the adoption of a resolution providing for all matters relating to the sale and issuance of school improvement bonds in a not-to-exceed principal amount of \$70 million.

8.02 Anthropology Textbooks

Physical Anthropology and Cultural Anthropology are two semester-long electives that will be offered to students in the 2021-22 academic year. Each course has a separate text and has been vetted by teachers and academic coaches. The committee is recommending the following two textbooks to move forward in the textbook adoption process:

- Physical Anthropology & Archaeology (ELE420): Understanding Humans: Introduction to Physical Anthropology and Archaeology – Cengage
- Cultural Anthropology & Linguistics (ELE430): Anthropology: Appreciating Human Diversity McGraw-Hill

In accordance with A.R.S. 15-721, the textbooks will be placed on display for the 60-day review period for comment at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center starting March 11, 2021. After the 60-day review period for public comments, the curriculum will be presented for approval.

8.04 Superintendent Comments

Dr. Casteel commented the second CUSD Educators COVID-19 vaccine POD went extraordinarily well last Saturday at Hamilton and Perry High Schools. More than 2,600 people were serviced, most receiving their second dose. She thanked the cabinet members for their assistance and Ken James and Frank Fletcher as the site leads. She also acknowledged that the success would not have been possible without the assistance of CORE Construction, Chasse Building Team, McCarthy Building Companies and Concord Construction for providing support, including tents, equipment, and lunch for our volunteers.

Even in this challenging year, we have many success stories that we share with the community on Facebook and Twitter and highlight at board meetings. ACP-Erie won the AIA Speech and Debate state title for the second straight year. Perry High was selected for their one-act play, *The Trojan Women*, by the Arizona Thespian Association to represent the state of Arizona in a national competition. In the athletic arena, Basha High won the first-ever AIA girls wrestling state championship over the weekend. Hamilton High's Pom Team won the AIA varsity spirit line state championship in the Large Jazz category. Soccer and basketball teams from several of our schools continue in the playoffs.

Dr. Casteel thanked the Arizona Rangers of Sun Lakes for dropping off more than 2,000 masks for us to disperse to our schools. They include KN95 protective masks for adults and some really cute masks for students, donated by Dick's Sporting Goods. We are so appreciative of the community support.

It is not too late to purchase a raffle ticket from the Chandler Education Foundation before the drawing on March 22nd. There are tickets available online at www.ChandlerEdFoundation or at any school or the District Office. Proceeds benefit our students and staff, primarily our IMPACT Chandler Scholars program.

Circumstances of the pandemic caused us to reduce our spring break to one week. Schools will be closed March 15-19, but the District Office will be open. Dr. Casteel asked families to stay cautious and get some much-needed rest.
