OPENPhysEd.org PK-12 resources will be used district-wide by teachers who support PK-12 physical education instruction, in conjunction with Dynamic PE ASAP K-12 resources. Total cost for the OPENPhysEd.org PK-12 resources is \$0.

6.01 <u>2021-2022 Metrics for Journey 2025 Final Report</u>

Dr. Jennifer Fletcher, Executive Director of Accountability, Assessment and Research, presented the 2021-2022 Metrics for Journey 2025 for review and discussion during the board retreat, which included finalized scores and expected scores based on previous trend data, for those data elements that did not yet have finalized scores.

Board members discussed what evidenced-based questions could be asked to judge employee satisfaction and how to obtain data without penalizing employees.

6.02 Proposed Increase in Breakfast and Lunch Prices for 2022-2023 School Year

The Food and Nutrition Department recommended price increases for the 2022-23 school year because prices have not been increased since the 2019-20 school year due to the participation in the Universal Free Meal programs. The costs associated with the programs have increased significantly due to inflation in both food and labor costs.

Board members asked questions regarding how the inflation has impacted families and Director Jenny Bracamonte stated the Free & Reduced table has not yet been made available but the staff will work with families on a personal level to get as many qualified as possible.

Approve the proposed breakfast price increase of \$0.25 and elementary lunch price increase of \$0.05 to cover increased food and labor costs associated with the school food service program.

6.03 First Amendment to IGA with City of Chandler for SRO's School Year 2021-22

The City of Chandler proposed a First Amendment to the original IGA dated May 20, 2021 which revises Section 1a to amend the total amount of assigned officers from seven to eight officers; and also revises Section 2a to amend the amounts for services for school year 2021-22. Projected total cost for the eight SRO's is \$1,115,568 which includes salary and benefits. It is estimated that the Safe Schools Program grant will fund \$687,366 and the District will fund fifty percent of the difference between the grant and actual SRO salary and benefits, which totals \$428,202. This leaves the District a total payment of \$214,101 for FY 2021-22.

Lindsay Love requested a study session in the future regarding the mental health pieces along with the goals of the SRO program and how that fits into the metrics of the Journey 2025 Plan. Dr. Gilbert explained that 2021-22 was the conclusion of year 2 of a three-year grant, but that he would be happy to share information and what is required by the grant. He also offered to meet with Lindsay to hear her concerns for going forward and to be able to provide requested information at the study session.

- 7.01 Out of State Student Travel Preplanning Forms for the 2022-2023 School Year
 The 2022-2023 Out of State Student Travel Preplanning Forms were provided for review. They will be returned for final approval at the June 22, 2022 Board meeting.
- 7.02 <u>Student Activity, Auxiliary Operations, and Tax Credit Reports</u>
 Student Activity (SA), Auxiliary Operations (AUX), and Tax Credit (TC) Reports for the months ending July 2021 through May 2022 were provided for review.
- 7.03 The Art of Education University FLEX Curriculum

Chandler Unified School District's Curriculum and Instruction team released a Request for Information for Visual Arts curriculum. Through the review process, the Art of Education University was selected for use in the K-12 setting. The total cost for a 5-year subscription for 10 teachers is \$28,566 including tax. In accordance with A.R.S. 15-721 and CUSD Policy IJJ, the Art of Education University FLEX digital curriculum materials will be placed on display for public review at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center for a period of 60-days starting June 9, 2022. In addition, digital access to the curriculum will be placed on the Curriculum webpage at the district website for review and comment. A final recommendation is anticipated at the August 24, 2022 Governing Board meeting.

7.04 <u>Lesson Planning for High School Physical Education with Web Resource from Human Kinetics</u>
Chandler Unified School District's Curriculum and Instruction team reviewed teacher materials for high school physical education to complement and enhance other adopted resources. Lesson Planning for High School Physical Education with Web Resource provides teachers with physical education classroom strategies and standards-based lesson plans. The total amount for 35 teachers including shipping, handling, and tax is \$2,227.77.

In accordance with A.R.S. 15-721 and CUSD Policy IJJ, Lesson Planning for High School Physical Education with Web Resource from Human Kinetics will be placed on display for public review at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center for a period of 60-days starting June 9, 2022. In addition, digital access to the resource will be placed on the Curriculum webpage at the district website for review and comment. A final recommendation is anticipated at the August 24, 2022 Board meeting.

7.05 iLitELL English Language Development (ELD) Curriculum

On November 10, 2021, The Governing Board approved the Curriculum and Instruction team's recommendation of Savvas' My Perspectives as the 6th grade English Language Arts (ELA) curriculum. Through communication with Savvas, the English Language Development (ELD) resource iLitELL, a new product which aligns to the adopted My Perspectives resource, was identified to meet the needs of the CUSD English Language Learner (ELL) students. The total amount for the print and digital iLitELL resource including shipping, handling, and tax is \$26,763.29.

In accordance with A.R.S. 15-721 and CUSD Policy IJJ, iLitELL from Savvas will be placed on display for public review and comment at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center for a period of 60-days starting June 9, 2022. A final recommendation is anticipated at the August 24, 2022 Board meeting.

7.07 <u>Superintendent Comments</u>

Superintendent Frank Narducci began with accolades:

- Hamilton High's Logan Salomon was selected as the Arizona Gatorade Baseball Player of the Year. This marks the 3rd Hamilton student athlete this school year to be selected (football, volleyball, baseball), and the first school ever in the entire country to do so! This is Hamilton's 5th student athlete to win the award in the span of 4 years.
- Sawyer Merrill of Auxier Elementary was named the Sun Lakes Rotary Sandy Lundberg Educator
 of the Year for 2022. This award recognizes and rewards excellence in education as reflected in
 the school district and the general community.

7.07 Superintendent Comments (cont'd)

- Congratulations to the Basha Accelerated Middle School Academic Pentathlon team! They
 finished in 1st place at the National Competition, making them not just back-to-back state
 champions, but back-to-back National Champions! This was a nail-biter with AMS beating out
 teams from Plano, Texas and Fairbanks, Alaska by a fraction of a point.
- The US Academic Pentathlon is an organization that sponsors academic competitions for middle schools in math, science, literature, social science, and fine arts. Overall medals are given to the students whose five subject scores add up to the overall highest scores in their GPA weight division. In addition, 38 individual event medals were earned by 19 of the 43 AMS academic pentathlon competitors.
- Chandler High resource teacher, Steve Vaught, was recognized by PayPal for his commitment to
 excellence working with students as a teacher, mentor, and coach. Coach Vaught was
 nominated by a parent for his work in the science classroom, as well as on the football field.
- Rice Elementary was awarded a \$20,000 grant from the Kroger Company Foundation to support
 the dedicated collaboration with the Fry's operating division. In the award letter, Kroger states
 "we are impressed with the work of the school in the community."
- The Hamilton High baseball team, under the direction of Coach Mike Woods, defeated rival Chandler High, 11-1, to win the 6A state title at Diablo Stadium. It was the Huskies' eight state title since 2003.
- At the International Science and Engineering Fair, Perry High School senior, Joshua Shank, won first place in his category - Robotics and Intelligent Machines. He also won a special award, the Dudley R. Herschbach award, that includes an all-expense-paid trip to the Stockholm International Youth Science Seminar and attendance to the Nobel Prize award ceremony in Sweden.
- CUSD was the #1 district in Arizona to raise money for the American Heart Association. The
 district raised a total of \$128,435 this year (compared to \$98,086 last year). The next closest
 district raised around \$80,000. This is a tremendous aspect of community. Thank you to the 17
 schools that participated in this fundraising event.
- The United States District Court of the District of Arizona lauded Hamilton High School Social Studies teacher, Brianna Willits, with the "Excellence in Civics Education Award". Brianna puts in countless hours to her department and students and is a great advocate for student success at Hamilton High School.

In closing, this is Mr. Frank Fletchers last board meeting - not sure if he is sad or joyful about that - but Frank started as the purchasing supervisor back in 1993. He worked under three Superintendents and quickly moved through the ranks to Associate Superintendent. Over the years, Frank has helped CUSD through the quickest growth period in the district's history, planning and building 2-3 schools per year with former Superintendent Dr. Casteel. He helped navigate and guide the district through challenging times and his footprint will be felt in the district for a long time to come. Frank always produced, was given impossible tasks, and worked efficiently and effectively to get them done. He is knowledgeable and savvy about contracts and we have depended on his expertise to improve protocols and practices. One of those areas was moving the maintenance work to three shifts as he built efficiency into when buildings can be available and not occupied in order to get work completed, gaining cost savings and work efficiency. Another is his ability to work a contract and timeline so that it was deliverable on time and under budget. Frank, just remember when we call, it will be safe to answer. Thank you for the contributions you have made to Chandler Unified School District. Enjoy retirement with your wonderful family - it is well earned!

Jason Olive requested further information about the DLI program at the junior high level. He has known Frank Fletcher a long time, as a vendor on the other side of the table and acknowledged Frank's expertise in contract negotiations. Jason also confirmed that ESSER money could be used on mental health.

Lara Bruner thanked everyone for sharing ideas to enhance CUSD's wellness initiatives. She recognized that it is important for the community to be active in the mental health arena, agreeing with Student Action Boards. Lara has worked with Brenda Vargas, counselors transitioned from academic to supporting the social emotional side, teachers stepped up, staff had trainings, there were workshops for families, mindfulness rooms were created at many schools - yet all of this is not enough. An evidence-based comprehensive plan needs to be created and she looks forward to what the Forum will bring.

Lindsay Love acknowledged the counseling departments and social workers are doing their best, but there is not enough to help all students. She was happy to see students and parents express their position and stated the board needed to get in the fight and be better for students.

Barb Mozdzen stated she would miss Mr. Fletcher, reminiscing of her first encounter with him many years ago at a school with the Art Masterpiece program. He resolved the matter and knew how to get things done.

Frank Fletcher replied that it had been his honor and privilege to serve the present and previous governing boards, along with the administration. He acknowledged the trust put in him is unparalleled across the valley.

Barb then addressed the students in the audience explaining that the district is providing professional development to staff regarding mental health and would like to look into some of the agencies to they have the tools for student-centered training. We do need a better way to communicate to the community and partner with agencies and local cities.
