4. Public Hearing

4.01 Public Hearing on the 2022-2023 School District Annual Proposed Expenditure Budget

Lana Berry, Chief Financial Officer, conducted a public hearing on the 2022-2023 School District Annual Proposed Expenditure Budget, outlining the details and explaining there was a historic investment in K-12 education during the legislative session. Session law allowed districts to adjust their budgets to encompass these changes for the adopted budgets. Mrs. Berry detailed the differences between the proposed budget from June 2022 and the adopted budget July 2022, as well as the differences between the 2021-22 revised budget and the adopted 2022-23 budget with an increase of \$35,498,972. There is also an overall tax decrease of approximately \$.11. Chandler is the second lowest tax rate of school districts in the east valley.

Administration will meet with certified and support staff leadership to determine a proposal for an additional raise to be approved by the Governing Board at a Special Meeting.

Four (4) Blue Bird 84-passenger buses (replacing 4 of the 12 CNG), twelve (12) Blue Bird 48-passenger Special Education buses w/wheelchair lift, two (2) Blue Bird 63-passenger Special Education with wheelchair lift, three (3) Micro Bird 14-passenger activity buses and one (1) Micro Bird 14-passenger activity bus with wheelchair lift, from Canyon State Bus Sales utilizing the Mohave contract 18F-CSBS-0904 for a total of \$4,141,585.56 minus the trade-in value of \$41,000 for thirty-nine (39) decommissioned buses.

Superintendent Frank Narducci began by thanking the new Cabinet for their attendance at the board meeting and their continued support. Mr. Narducci thanked Dr. Wendy Nance, Abby Druck, and the entire Human Resource team for onboarding more than 300 new teachers. New teachers attended orientation last week with returning teachers and many support staff back this week. Also, a special thank you to Mrs. Berry, Mr. Tom Dunn, Jaydee Finney, and the entire support services team who have worked many hours over the past 7 weeks to ensure the facilities are ready for students. All that is remaining is for students to remember to set their alarm clocks next Wednesday! CUSD offers many choices for every learning style. If you have not registered for 2022-2023, it is not too late. School offices are open and, together with District Office staff, can help find a perfect fit for your children. We do not typically have much in the way of sports highlights during the summer, but this year is the exception. Jennifer Seo of Hamilton High School rallied to win the National High School Golf Invitational. Jennifer trailed by two strokes entering the final day, in sixth place overall, but shot a magical five-underpar in the final round capturing the title at Pinehurst Resort in North Carolina last month. Jennifer is not only the first from CUSD to win the tournament, but also the first from Arizona!

Today was a high energy special day as we kicked-off the teachers returning with four Welcome Home Rallies, complete with a professional development speaker setting the vision, and also a little fun. It was great seeing the certified staff return from summer break and ready to start the new school year on July 20, 2022.

Operation Back to School is happening this Saturday, July 16th, in the student parking lot at Chandler High School. A volunteer group called For Our City will be distributing backpacks with school supplies from 8-10:00 am. Students must be in the car to receive a backpack. A number of our staff have assisted with this project. We anticipate serving approximately 3,000 Chandler families.

Mr. Narducci concluded by thanking our legislators for fighting to support K-12 education. The historical investment in K-12 will be put to good use in supporting our students and staff. He recognized the courage and work of Representative Jennifer Pawlik (present in the meeting tonight), Senator Sean Bowie, Representative Jeff Weninger, Senator JD Messnard, Representative Mitzi Epstein, and Representative Jennifer Jermaine for supporting CUSD and for all the legislators across the state for supporting public education in Arizona.

Joel Wirth stated some of the community wants the district to run like a business. He explained that it took 40 years to build a contingency and cautioned the District needs to be careful how that money is spent. He also reminded that Arizona is funded 49th in the nation.

Lindsay Love acknowledged some of the 2022 Chandler graduates in the audience and thanked them for their attendance at the meeting. They have formed a student coalition that is civically engaged and working on local political campaigns.

Jason Olive thanked Jennifer Pawlik for helping with funding for schools. He recently saw a billboard advertising teaching positions in Texas starting at \$102,000 and acknowledged that Chandler cannot match that but are continually trying to do better by teachers and take care of students.

Lara Bruner attended some of the certified staff rallies and admitted she did not know how entertaining Mr. Narducci could be. She welcomed the new teachers and welcome back returning staff that are so committed to students. She also thanked For Our City for organizing the school supply drive.

Barb Mozdzen also thanked the Legislators, specifically Jennifer Pawlik for their support, appreciating the extra work to provide additional funding to public education. She is excited for the school year to begin, meeting new and returning staff. Barb appreciates the work teachers are putting in prior to students arriving next week.
