Kurt Rohrs - Job Skills Teaching - Advocated for more job skills training for students as well as a companion program for adult education and urged the District to take the lead in developing these programs. He expressed gratitude to Lara Bruner for her service to CUSD the past 4 years. Although they may have different perceptions of some of the issues, he appreciated her grace, patience, willingness to listen, and efforts to find common ground to move forward. She has been a positive example of the way board members should conduct themselves and hopefully will be passed down to students as a model of behavior.

Dawn Shim - LGBTQ Students - Commended CUSD on the idea of hosting a mental health summit, but do not agree with the way it was carried out. National statistics were used, but more students should have been involved with local information. The event was badly publicized. There was also a lack of inclusion of LGBTQ or minority students. She requested that CUSD adopt a similar policy like TUHSD to affirm and include LGBTQ students and staff. She also stated they have asked for a student board for several months.

8.04 <u>Secondary Curriculum - AP European History</u>

Recommend approval of Wiesner-Hanks, Merry E., Clare Haru Crowston, Joe Perry, & John P. Mckay. A History of Western Society. 13th ed. New York: Bedford/St. Martin's Publishing, 2020 to be used in a new elective, AP European History. The cost for a class set is \$5,921.16 including estimated tax, shipping, and processing. This includes 40 student editions, 1-year subscription for 40 students to LaunchPad (digital resources), a Teacher's Resource Flash Drive, Teacher's Edition, and ExamView Assessment Suite. This will be initially funded through district funds.

In accordance with A.R.S. 15-721, the textbook was placed on display for the 60-day review period for comment at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center starting August 25, 2022. There were no comments.

8.05 Contract Increase - Athletic Apparel and Equipment

The Board approved an increase for BSN Sports for Athletic Apparel and Equipment utilizing State Contract ADSPO18-208270 on September 28, 2022 to \$450,000.00 due to Eastbay Sports being acquired by BSN Sports. Requested approval to increase the total amount to \$600,000.00 for Athletic Apparel and Equipment for the remainder of the 2022-23 school year.

- 8.06 Contract Increase Yearbook Publishing and Design The Board approved annual contracts with estimated spending on June 22, 2022. At that time \$250,000.00 was estimated for yearbook publishing and design utilizing SAVE Contract 43-20-24 which was awarded to Balfour Publishing, Herff Jones, Jostens, and Lifetouch National. Requested approval to increase the total amount to \$350,000.00 for yearbook publishing and design for high school and junior highs for the remainder of the 2022-23 school year.
- 8.07 <u>Contract Increase Public Communication Equipment</u> The Board approved annual contracts with estimated spending on June 22, 2022. At that time \$250,000.00 was estimated for Public Communication Equipment utilizing State Contract CTR046826 which was awarded to Kelley Communications. Requested approval to increase the total amount to \$350,000.00 for the purchase and repair of radios for the remainder of the 2022-23 school year.
- 8.08 <u>Contract Increase Exterior and Interior Painting</u> The Board approved annual contracts with estimated spending on June 22, 2022. At that time \$500,000.00 was estimated for exterior and interior painting utilizing Mohave Contract 20A-RIDDLE-0404 which was awarded to Riddle Painting and Coatings. The Curricular Framework maps to learning objectives for academic standards such as Common Core, Next-Generation Science Standards, and aligned with the CTE Digital Animation technical standards.

10.06 Game Design & Development Adoption - CTE Game Design & 3D Animation Courses

Game Design & 3D Animation is a new Career and Technical Education (CTE) program offered at Chandler High School CTEC campus for grades 9-12. The committee is recommending Game Design & Development Curriculum by Steve Isaacs to move forward in the textbook adoption process. This resource will be used specifically for GDA200 Game Design & 3D Animation 2 course beginning school year 2023-24.

There is no cost associated with this resource as it is free to educators. Game Design & Development Curriculum was developed by Steve Isaacs, a former middle school and high school teacher. This curriculum provides hands-on projects, lesson plans to be used with the Unreal Engine and aligned with the CTE Digital Animation technical standards.
