## 11.04 Fee Schedules for the 2024-2025 School Year

Pursuant to A.R.S. 15-342, a school district may charge fees for school activities and programs. The Board recognizes the need for student fees to fund certain school activities that are not financed by local, state, or federal funds. It also recognizes that some students may not be able to pay these fees. All fees shall contain a provision that allows the fees to be waived in the event of economic hardship to the pupil. No student will be denied an education as a result of inability to pay these supplementary charges.

Elementary and Secondary Course Fees/CTE Course Fees:

Elementary, Secondary and CTE course/activity changes highlighted in RED have minimally increased from the previous board approved fee schedules. The majority of these changes are due to material/supply price increases. Fees that are black are at no change from the previous school year. Fees that are GREEN have decreased from last year. Fee changes to CTE course fees were also minor and were necessary to cover the cost of increased material/supply prices or were due to a new course being added. Also included in this fee schedule are Kindergarten Readiness and Gifted Testing fees. There are no changes to these fees from the previous year.

## 12.03 RFP# 91-24-29 Custodial Management Services

The Memorandum of Understanding between Chandler Unified School District and AZCEND will operate a family resource center and offer programs at the San Marcos Elementary School where families will have access to the resource center as well as preschool type programs to help get students and families prepared for elementary schools.

A total of four (4) vendors responded to the solicitation and the top two (2) vendors were chosen for the presentation stage. The top two vendors chosen for presentations were:

- Aramark Educational Services
- HES Facilities

Of the two (2) vendors chosen for the presentation, only one (1) vendor provided a presentation. A core committee of five (5) employees consisting of district administrators and site leaders evaluated the written responses and presentations. Two additional staff members were invited to observe the presentation.

The Custodial Management Services contract will be for one year with the option to renew it on an annual basis for four (4) additional years. CUSD requested Board approval for the award of RFP 91-24-29 Custodial Management Services, in the amount of \$2,903,677.37 for the 2024-2025 fiscal year. A summary of the evaluation is attached. A brief presentation will be provided to further explain the District's needs.

## 13.02 Sonday Reading Program by Winsor Learning

Chandler Unified School District uses curricula aligned to the Arizona State Standards to meet the diverse learning needs of students. Our current resource for Tier 3 and Specially Designed Instruction is the Wilson Reading System. We will continue to have access to the materials on hand. Sonday Reading Program is a structured, multisensory approach to teaching reading, specifically targeting students with dyslexia and other reading difficulties. It's based on Orton-Gillingham principles, which emphasize a systematic, phonics-based approach to teaching literacy. The Sonday Reading Program is more cost effective for the district both in time for teachers and in financial commitment over time.

Request approval to purchase via cooperative contract through Dysart Unified School District. Sonday System 1, Sonday Leveled Readers System 1, Sonday System 2, Sonday Leveled Readers System 2, and Sonday Building Fluency Workbook for all 32 elementary sites. Training for implementation can be provided in-house by our academic specialists. We expect to reduce the annual cost for Wilson Reading System materials and training. These materials and training meet the same needs as Wilson provides our students with unique needs for specially designed instruction and tier 3 support.

The cost for all 32 sites is \$174,701.54 including estimated tax, shipping, and processing. The purchase of this resource will be paid for using Special Education M&O funds.

In accordance with ARS 15-721 and CUSD Policy IJJ, this resource will be placed on display for a period of 60 days for review and comment at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center starting May 9, 2024. This item will be brought back for governing board action on July 10, 2024.
