We Take Care of Each Other

Big Idea: I love my family and they love me. **Concepts:** Caring and kindness, family roles and responsibilities, interdependence, feelings **Theme Vocabulary:** caring, cousins, feelings, love

Mass:

Children can relate better to the word *weight* than the word *mass* at this age, so weight is used when directed to children throughout this topic. The use of words such as heavy/light and more/less are the beginning of the developmental trajectory. Later, language is extended to create comparative language such as is lighter/heavier than. This is an important step in learning about mass since it allows children time to start comparative thinking about this attribute in everyday objects.

Blocks Measure Up: In *Block by Block*, children enjoy the story *What's Down the Block?*, in which a boy and his father measure things they find around their neighborhood. Children use 1" blocks to measure the length of books found in their classroom.
