Course Description and Objectives

Agriculture Shop is a nine-week course designed to provide students with woodworking basics that include safety, tool identification, tool use, design, layout, and construction. Students will expand their skills with the creation of a birdhouse designed to challenge them and provide a rewarding outcome. In addition, the course will focus on teamwork and professional attitudes. Group work and presentations will be utilized often in the class. Students can apply this knowledge to be selfefficient in project planning.

Students will keep a warm-up log daily that will be counted for a grade and safety/participation points in the shop will be given at the instructor's discretion.

Shop laboratory procedures:

All laboratory procedures including personal conduct, safety, and laboratory use will be defined in detail during the beginning unit of this course. All students will be required to pass a safety exam and have a signed agreement on file in order to operate equipment in the shop. Please be aware that students who are disruptive during lab days will be given an alternative assignment and earn a maximum of 50% credit for the day. There is zero tolerance toward disruption in the shop setting.

Late work:

Assignments turned in late, but not due to absence(s) will be accepted, but at half points.

Make-up work:

It is your responsibility to pick up any missed assignments from the absent work folder. I suggest making a good friend that you can depend on for notes, etc. Many labs will consist of materials that are available only at the time of the lab. Missed labs must be made up after school within one week. If you don't understand the assignment please ask, I am here to help you. You have the amount of days you were excused to make up missed work; otherwise it becomes late work and worth half points. Class time will not be used to explain missed work.
