#### ELA Lessons

<u>Brock:</u> We are continuing to work with sentence fluency. The kids have been working to take smaller sentences to create more fluid sentences. Next cycle we will start focusing more on what it takes to write a good paragraph.

Ryle: Continuing to compare "The Hero's Journey" and Percy Jackson. We have examined model paragraphs that bring together the two texts and will be working on perfecting our own responses.

<u>Sherwood</u>: We have begun the first essay. Students have been working with short articles about different explorers. They previously wrote a paragraph about each to explain why they explored and some related details. The essay will compare the three explorers. Students will use the articles as well as additional research, as needed, to complete the multi-paragraph essay. It will be typed on Office 365, at school.

### Math Lessons

<u>Brock:</u> We have been working on converting fractions, decimals and percents. We are also continuing our vacation project. A lot of the kids have started their posters.

Ryle: Quidditch: Division with multi-digit divisors and dividends Firebolts: Algebraic Expressions Dementors: Mean average deviation, application

<u>Sherwood</u>: Lava Group has begun Chapter 2, which is working with decimals and fractions. Water and Milk Groups are working on finishing Chapter 1. A test is tentatively scheduled the week of Sept 10th.

#### Science | essons

We are finishing up our unit on Matter. We will be starting our next unit of Force and Motion. At the end of this unit we will be making catapults. Please see the email about donations for supplies for this project.

#### Social Studies | essons

We have completed our review of indigenous peoples living in the Americas before European colonization and will soon be moving to study European colonization.
