The AIMS Reading Test will be administered on Tuesday, February 25<sup>th</sup> to

- all 10<sup>th</sup> grade students
- juniors and seniors who have not yet passed AIMS Reading
- juniors and seniors who signed up to attempt to EXCEED Reading

Students who do not test will be released at 10:00 a.m. on both testing days. Regular bus routes will run at 10:00 a.m. and 2:14 p.m. on both days.

Lunch: 10:05 a.m. – 10:35 a.m.

Testing: 10:45 a.m. – 2:14 p.m.

To ensure the integrity of testing, students participating in the test will not be released early and are encouraged to bring a book to read.
