Visit www.cgc.edu/dual and (1) create your MEID number; (2) apply to Chandler-Gilbert Community College; (3) and take the Accuplacer test. CHS will administer the Accuplacer test July 28-31 (3-4p.m.) in the library and is offering a Parent Night (July 28 & 29) in the library from 5-7 p.m. to walk families through the Dual Enrollment process.
