#### **Student Responsibilities**

Student Responsibilities:

All students are required to bring their school-issued laptop to class EVERY DAY, and are encouraged to bring a charger if needed. Each student is responsible for proper care and maintenance of their electronic devices. Teachers and Staff are not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged laptops or chargers.

Phones will be placed in the Phone Daycare for the entirety of class. Students may not use earbuds or headphones during class unless instructed by the teacher. A power strip for charging is available at Phone Daycare, however students must provide their own charging cable and block.

No one benefits from cheating/plagiarizing. If caught cheating/plagiarizing you and the person you cheated/plagiarized from will receive a 0 on the assignment and a referral. If the assignment is for another class, that teacher will be notified and they will issue their consequence. Cheating is defined as acting dishonestly or unfairly in order to gain an advantage, especially in a game or examination. Plagiarism is the practice of taking someone's work or ideas and passing them off as one's own. Perry High School has a more detailed policy on this in the student handbook.

### Late work

Late Work Policy

All work is due by the posted date and time in Google Classroom. Assignments not submitted via GC are not considered 'turned in'. If submitted after the due date/time the following late policy will be followed: Less than 24 hours late = 50% 24+ hours late = 0%

You will receive a deadline extension of 1 day for each day of absence, and you must include a comment on the assignment in Google Classroom stating your date of absence when submitting late work. If you are absent the day a project is due, it is due on the day that you return. If you are to be absent from class for several days it is your responsibility to communicate with the instructor. Most work will be assigned through Google Classroom and it is your responsibility to complete any missed assignments. Please email your teacher if you have questions regarding assignments while absent.

## **Assessments and Assignments**

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some

exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.
