Arizona Geography Cookie Map Project

As a class we have agreed to be creative in the way that we show our knowledge of Arizona Geography! Students will be making a large cookie map of our state. Here is a general idea of how it will work:

- Students can work alone or with a partner (where they will create one cookie map together).
- ❖ At home, students need to <u>bake</u> a 9" x 13" cookie (recipe on back) and bring it to school, <u>covered and still in the pan</u>, on **Friday, November 1st**. If students are working with a partner, only one person needs to bake a cookie. (Directions and suggestions for baking the cookie will be provided.)
- ❖ Before Wednesday, students need to:
 - decide which food items to use to represent the landforms and places on their cookie maps. They need to bring in their food items by Wednesday, October 30th. (Frosting will be donated and shared with the class.)
 - make toothpick/paper flags at home that will be used to label cities and places on their maps. Flags are due Monday, October 28th.

The end result will be a large cookie map of Arizona that shows just how much the students have learned about the geography of our state. The cookie dough maps will be graded on Friday, November 1st. Students will take home their projects on Friday to share with your family.

If students are working with a partner, they will cut the cookie in half and each take half of it home to share.

Cookie Recipe

When I tried this project with the class, I used the Nestle Toll House Chocolate Chip Cookie Recipe (and omitted the chocolate chips and nuts). The cookie turned out great (nice and thick, and still soft enough to insert the toothpick flags). You can use a recipe of your own, if you'd like, although this is the recipe I would suggest.

2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour

1 tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. salt

1 cup (2 sticks) butter or margarine, softened

3/4 cup granulated sugar

3/4 cup packed brown sugar

1 tsp. vanilla extract

2 large eggs

PREHEAT: oven to 375 F.

COMBINE: flour, baking soda, and salt in small bowl. Beat butter, sugars, and vanilla in large mixer bowl until creamy. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Gradually beat in flour mixture.

GREASE: 9"x13" cake pan (or 10" x 15" jelly-roll pan).

SPREAD: dough into prepared pan

BAKE: 20-25 minutes or until golden brown. Cool in pan on wire rack.



SUPER SHORTCUTS:

* Buy the pre-made sugar cookie dough in the refrigerated section; press it into a **9 x 13" pan** and bake.

OR

* Bake a brownie mix in a 9 x 13" pan
