WHAT IS STUDENT COUNCIL?

- Student Council is a **leadership organization** for the school.
- Student leaders from 4th, 5th, and 6th grade are elected to represent their class for the year.
- Students running for an officer position give a speech and are elected *by vote*.
- Student Council focuses on **service projects** for our school AND community. We help to make important decisions about events and service projects on campus.



WHAT IS STUDENT COUNCIL? (CONT.)

EXPECTATIONS

- Attend and participate in ALL meetings.
- Meetings will be on Tuesdays from 7:15-7:45 (8:00 if needed)
- **Be on time** and come prepared.
- You are allowed only two absences and two tardies for the year (more than that WILL result in removal from position).
- Exemplary grades (A's & B's)
- **Leadership behavior (no referrals)**
- Must be available to volunteer before and after school for at least one shift every event.



POSITIONS

■ I. Student Body President

- A. Represent the student body at school and district events
- B. Supervise the functioning of the elected student body officers.
- C. Develop the agenda for and preside over the meetings of Student Council.

■ II. Student Body Vice-President

- A. Represent the student body at school events.
- B. Coordinate the work of committees.
- C. Preside over Student Council meetings in the absence of the president.

■ III. Student Body Secretary

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- A. Prepare agendas for meetings.
- B. Take and distribute minutes of meetings.
- C. Type material for student body officers
- D. Sign all purchase orders.

■ IV. Student Body Treasurer

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- A. Present the proposed budget to Student Council for adoption.
- B. Maintain financial records of the student body.
- C. Coordinate fundraising projects for the student body.
- D. Sign all purchase orders.

■ V. Student Body Historian

- A. Gather materials in preparation for the Student Council Bulletin Board
- B. Be responsible for the completion of the bulletin board.
- C. Maintain a file of materials about activities of the school.
- D. Make sure pictures are taken of all activities.



OFFICER CAMPAIGN GUIDELINES

- Each candidate may have up to 2 posters. Posters must be approved by Clareson before being hung (Monday 8/14).
- The posters must be student made and homemade. Posters may not be larger than 18x24 (No professional printing EX: Staples)
- Application should be turned in to Clareson by Monday 8/14
 - Teacher Rec should be turned in to McKeever by the teacher by Wed 8/16.
- Speeches are limited to 2 minutes and uploaded to Flipgrid by Wed. 8/16. (Approved and posted by sponsor by 8/18)
- Speeches may include any music or other multimedia as long as it's appropriate.
- Candidates may not pass out any memorabilia during the campaign week.
- Speeches may include homemade props or skits.
 - Elections will be held on 8/18 in classrooms. Results will be shared by end of the day that Friday.
