Dual Enrollment

You can save money on tuition by earning college credits during high school. The Chandler Unified School District's that offer dual enrollment are Arizona Prep College, Basha High School, Chandler High School, Casteel High School, Hamilton High School, and Perry High School. To be eligible, students must meet college admission requirements.

Some classes may require you to pass a free placement test. Reach out to your high school counselor for more information.

Dual enrollment is a program through Chandler-Gilbert Community College (CGCC) that allows you to earn college credit while attending your high school classes that can then transfer to a community college or four-year university. It is different than advanced placement (AP) classes which require you to pass a test to earn college credit. Passing an AP class does not guarantee credit, and colleges vary in their acceptance of AP class credits. Dual enrollment students receive a grade and credit for work completed throughout the year. These credits usually transfer to your college of choice as direct course equivalents. CGCC and the Maricopa County Community Colleges District have agreements with the three Arizona state universities as well as many out-of-state colleges to accept dual enrollment class credit.
