Course Description

Cadet Band class is recommended for those who have been playing a band instrument for two years or less and is also open to beginning students who want to learn to play a band instrument. Most continuing band students from elementary school take this course. Students will continue to learn instrument-specific techniques, note recognition, rhythmic accuracy, sight-reading, and tonal development, as well as develop an appreciation of music history and expression. Students will perform for various concerts, school functions, and festivals several times throughout the school year.

Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Quarter grades

Grades are determined by your authentic participation in the growth process. Areas that are simultaneously assessed include:

- + Performance Assessment: these are small technical or musical skills being recorded and submitted for feedback. The materials may be based on the literature we are working on, or could be a technique that is foundational for your instrumental performance.
- + Performance Reflexivity: you are expected to actively participate in reflections and goal setting. These goals will be created by you (with guidance from me). We will use them as reference to measure your progress and refine both micro and macro targets along the way.
- + Performance Demonstration: these public performances may include night concerts, in class playing, or any other live performance setting.

Semester grades

Semester grades are calculated using 40/40/20: Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
