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Learning in our Classroom

<u>5th Grade Language Arts</u>: This week, we are working in Lesson 24, which features a historical fiction anchor text about a pioneer girl. Students will take their Grammar Quiz on easily confused verbs on Tuesday, and will be "making comparisons" as their lesson this week.

<u>Accelerated Language Arts</u>: The students will be reading "Robotics" from our Harcourt series. We will also be working on week 3 of the Civil War menu.

<u>Writing:</u> Students will create a journal and use it to write responses to Civil War videos and articles. <u>5th Grade Math:</u> The students will begin Chapter 11 on Measurement.

<u>Accelerated Math</u>: We are in our textbook's last chapter on Statistical Displays. Students will be studying the first few lessons this week and will be learning how to create line plots, histograms, and box plots. The textbook has online resources for extra support and practice.

<u>Science/Social Studies</u>: We will work on our Civil War unit and will begin a simulation involving elements of the war. The students will continue to have the opportunity to take the state quiz. Students must identify and name the states on a blank map of the United States. Students should be studying for this quiz at home.
