Course Overview

Course Description

The rigorous pre-AP/IB course is equivalent to college algebra and trigonometry at the university using algebraic manipulation, graphing, and application. This course provides a more rigorous approach to the topics covered in Precalculus as preparation for AP or IB programs. Students will investigate functions, mathematical modeling, exponential and logarithmic equations, discrete mathematics, and trigonometry. Students will use the standards for mathematical practice to engage with the subject matter.

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Quarter grades

-All homework and in-class assignments will make up 10% of the quarter grade throughout the semester.

-Tests will be worth 65% of the quarter grade.

-Quizzes will be worth 25% of the quarter grade.
